A WHEELY FUN WEEK IN YEAR 2 By Michael Aryiku, Year 2 Pandas Class Teacher





Anticipation has been building in the Year 2 classes this week as the Pandas, Alligators, Elephants and Monkeys prepare to design and make their own vehicles.


This week, the children have been learning about the different parts of a vehicle, including the axel, chassis, wheels and body. Following this, they used the Skitch app on the iPads to take a picture of a toy car before annotating it with the different parts.


Alongside this, the Year 2 children began thinking about the axels they would use when designing and making their vehicles. Using dowels, MDF wheels and plastic straws, the children had a go at making their own axels, taking into consideration the distance needed between the wheels to support their vehicles.

YEAR 6 TALK ABOUT THEIR SWIMMING PROGRAMME By Elizabeth Jurgensen, Year 6 Eagles Class Teacher

This week was the last week of the Year 5/6 swimming programme for this year. Over the seven weeks the children have made progress in many areas of swimming including water confidence, stroke formation and style and being able to swim longer distances.

Please see below some comments from children about their learning in swimming:

Amy: We had fun at swimming. My favourite thing was learning to dive and do somersaults because when you dive and your fingertips touch the water you feel like you are gliding down through the water.

Saul: I learnt to swim backstroke properly. You need to slice your arm back into the water and then scoop yourself forward.

Ben Aurel: I learnt how to increase my speed in butterfly by doing two penguin type kicks instead of one.

Edgar: I learnt to keep my body floating on top of the water while I am doing backstroke. This helps with my breathing and helps me kick my legs better.
