Firstly we would like to warmly welcome you to the British Vietnamese School Summer School 2017.


We are thrilled that you have chosen BVIS Summer School programme for your child and we really do believe it will be the best programme to date.

Week 3 Theme Celebration week


The final week is a chance to come together and to showcase all the staff and students' hard work to each other and the parents.
