Introduction

Summer Performing Arts with Juilliard is an immersive experience for students to engage in music, dance or drama while making powerful connections with like-minded people from across the world. Through working with Juilliard artist faculty, students ages 10-18 will make great strides in their discipline of interest and build self-confidence, creativity and cultural awareness at the same time.

This two-week intensive programme, for both day and boarding students, explores the worlds of music, drama and dance. Taking place at the prestigious boarding school Collège du Léman, students will be inspired by the picturesque Swiss countryside on the shores of Lake Geneva. Along with daily classes, students will enjoy outdoor activities, the natural landscape of Switzerland, and culture and music from around the world.

Summer Performing Arts Programme Overview

This programme is a transformative experience for budding young musicians, dancers, and actors. During the two weeks, students will make incredible technical and artistic strides. Working closely each day with Juilliard artist faculty in both group and one-to-one sessions, daily schedules include rehearsals, coaching, and masterclasses in ensembles, culminating in memorable and life shaping performances for every student. In addition, your child will experience world-class performances by Juilliard artist faculty and guests. The programme will challenge students in their artistic passion while also exploring creative, interdisciplinary collaborations with students across music, dance and drama.

Students can choose from the following two tracks that will cater to their interests and levels of experience:

DISCOVERY PROGRAMME

Designed for those with wide ranging interests, students can choose both a major and minor course of study from among the three disciplines – music, dance, and drama:

- This track is ideal for students with multiple interests (i.e. piano and dance, drama and voice, etc).
- Spending roughly three-quarters of their day in a major course of study, students can sample a minor class as a welcomed opportunity to experience another discipline.

YOUNG ARTIST PROGRAMME

Designed for the advanced performing artist who wants to focus deeply on their chosen discipline in music, dance or drama:

- Ideal for students that have been studying their discipline for at least two years and are already performing at an advanced level.
- Students will participate in additional rehearsals for Young Artist ensembles, additional private one-to-one lessons and have more performance opportunities.
- The Young Artist programme is a selective programme. Admission is subject to a successful audition.

Courses of study for the two programmes will largely overlap with the exception of Discovery students who will rotate into their minor disciplines in the second half of the day.



Music Programme

Students participating in the Music programme (instrumental, vocal, piano) will be inspired and challenged by working closely with their teachers in orchestra, choir, and smaller ensembles. Over the course of two weeks, students will develop their technical abilities and use their new skills to play with passion and depth. Each student will receive private instruction from the faculty and will have the opportunity to participate in seminars and workshops including:

- Daily master classes / group performance classes
- Music theory / composition
- Improvisation
- Vocal diction
- Body awareness / yoga
- Rhythm and groove
- Movement
- Piano literature classes
- Large ensemble rehearsals, group sectionals, group classes
- Private one-to-one, practice, chamber music



Drama Programme

Great acting begins with the joy of playing, the pleasure of excellence, and the freedom to let the imagination soar. Guided by faculty from Juilliard's Drama Division, students will enjoy learning creative physical expression, vocal exploration with text and music, ensemble acting, and a variety of fun techniques aimed toward liberating the theatrical imagination.

Working and playing in groups, students will move step by step toward a creative stage performance where heightened language and physical expression merge. Come join us as we bring the language of Shakespeare to life, playfully explore imaginary scenes from classic myths, and experience the unique joys of ensemble acting.

The classes will offer experiences in the following:

- Theatre games
- Physical character
- Audition techniques
- Voice and speech
- Warm up techniques
- Shakespeare
- Enhanced theatrical movement
- Page to stage, bringing text to life



Dance Programme

The Dance programme provides dancers with the opportunity to expand their technique and creativity in a supportive and inspiring atmosphere. By sharing and collaborating with other young artists from around the globe, dance students will expand their creative range, become stronger performers, and develop new and lasting friendships and connections.

Working with Juilliard artist faculty, consisting of professional dancers and choreographers, dance students will have a daily schedule that includes a morning warm up or stretch class, technique classes (ballet and contemporary dance), rehearsal, improvisation, dance composition, jazz, and tap dance. Specific skills and abilities to be developed include:

- Core strength and flexibility
- Alignment and balance
- Spatial awareness
- Musicality and rhythmic clarity
- Improvisation skills
- Performance skills and artistry
- Choreographic craft
- Familiarisation with and retention of new movement styles

0730	Rise and shine!

Featured Excursions

Swiss Cultural Trip

Students will get a taste of Swiss culture as we take them to the countryside to visit the local cheese and chocolate factory. Souvenir shopping in Geneva

July is the perfect time to be in Geneva. The temperature averages at a balmy 26 degrees Celsius during the day making it the perfect time to do some souvenir shopping and tour some of the city features.



Benefits of Studying the Performing Arts

Along with fostering skills in the performing arts, studies have shown that a supplementary education in the arts engages children's cognitive, social and emotional development. Our initial research has also shown that students become more confident and creative as a result of the Juilliard embedded performing arts curriculum. Summer Performing Arts with

Juilliard – Nord Anglia is an inclusive programme that will challenge advanced students while cultivating interest in students who have experience in a broader range of performing arts. Tailored to place students in appropriate level ensembles, the programme will create stimulating, meaningful experiences for all.

Boarding at Collège du Léman

The prestigious Collège du Léman boarding school is nestled in a pristine valley between the Jura Mountains and Lake Geneva. The campus, only a 20 minute drive from Geneva city centre, houses state-of-the-art classrooms and recreational facilities including a swimming pool, multipurpose gymnasium, tennis courts and a sports field.

The Summer Performing Arts Programme with Juilliard offers students both boarding and day options. For non-local families wishing to take up the day student option, there are a number of suitable hotels within a short distance from Collège du Léman. Further details can be given upon request.

Arrival and Departure

On arrival at Geneva Airport, students will be greeted by Collège du Léman staff at our special Arrivals Area Desk. They will ensure that students get on one of our buses for the very short ride to Collège du Léman.

Orientation will commence after dinner on Saturday 8th July. The programme will culminate with final performances on the afternoon and evening of Friday, 21st July. Students should plan to depart on Saturday, 22nd July.

Getting in and out of Geneva

Transport to and from Geneva Airport is included on the days of arrival and departure. Outside of the arrival and departure dates the cost is CHF 200 per trip. For the care of the unaccompanied minors, there is a fee of CHF 100 each way.

Accommodation

Our boarding houses are separate for boys and girls and all have a lively common room and kitchen. Students of similar age will be assigned to each cosy room. Your child will enjoy furnished rooms with twin beds, work tables and bedding. Rooms will be cleaned every two days.

Please note: Students will need to bring their own towel as we do not provide towels.

House Parents

Our house parents are your child's first point of contact. They have a wealth of experience in taking care of students who are away from home and are eager to do anything to help make your child's stay a happy one. House parents will make sure that your child understands the routine, what to do if they need help, give support, or just want a friendly chat.

Dining

Student co-ed dining halls will serve nutritious, well-balanced meals. High quality ingredients are sourced regionally, and meals made fresh daily by our catering team with many options to choose from. We believe that healthy meals feed the hungry mind.

Children will also have the option to buy snacks from the school shop. Collège du Léman is able to accommodate students with food allergies (please contact us directly if you need more information).





FAQ

Can I participate if I'm a beginner?

For dance, drama and music (vocal) students, beginner level is no problem. For music (instrumental) students, a minimum of 1-2 years of experience on one's instrument is advised and participants must be able to read music.

Will instruments be provided?

Instrumentalists will be asked to bring their own instruments, except pianists, for which pianos will be made available by the programme. Please contact our staff for more information on instruments and whether or not this programme is the right fit for your child's discipline.

What language will the Summer Performing Arts with Juilliard programme be taught in?

The programme will be taught in English, so we recommend that participants' English language skills are at an intermediate level to be able to access the programme. Please contact us if you have any questions.

Will my child receive a certificate after the Summer Performing Arts with Juilliard programme?

Your child will receive a certification of participation at the end of the programme.

What if my child has a medical emergency?

There is a fully operational medical centre with professional nurses, equipment and beds available at Collège du Léman. In the unlikely event of a medical emergency our staff will contact the nearest hospital.

Will my child be safe?

The safety and welfare of your child is our highest priority and we have robust health and safety policies in place. Our teachers will check attendance throughout the day and house parents will ensure that all students are accounted for in the evening. Collège du Léman has dedicated and highly trained professional security personnel on site 24/7 and extensive CCTV monitoring across the site to ensure facilities are secure.

Safety boxes are also available in each bedroom for your child's convenience. Collège du Léman house parents will supervise all excursions for a fun and safe trip.

Application and Payment

Application Process

All prospective students are required to complete an online application before **May 1**. Students must supply certain materials, including a video audition and a teacher recommendation form provided by the programme.

Payment

A deposit of CHF \$300 (approximately \$297 USD) is required when submitting your child's application and audition. The remaining fee (minus the deposit) will be paid upon acceptance into the programme. Further instructions are included in the application itself.

Fees:

Day students: CHF 4000 (approx. \$3994 USD)*

Boarding students: CHF 5700 (approx. \$5690 USD)*

Nord Anglia students will enjoy our summer programme with a 15% discount off the full price.

*This fee excludes flights and visa costs. Please note that the USD conversion is based on current exchange rates and will vary based on your bank provider.

Services included in your fees for all day and boarding students:

- Full-time lessons during week days and Sundays, 9 July and 16 July
- Lunch

Additional services for boarding students:

- Housekeeping and laundry services (a washing machine and laundry powder are available in every house)
- Transportation and admission fees for excursions around Geneva
- Fully furnished rooms and bedding
- Breakfast and dinner
- All pastoral care throughout the two weeks
- Health Insurance

Reminder:

- Parents will need to apply for a visa for their child. Our fee does not include the cost of the visa.
- An additional charge of CHF 50 will be charged for a visa letter.
- Fees do not include costs for flights.

Spending money:

For the two week programme we suggest parents give children CHF 200 (approx. \$198 USD) spending money for souvenirs or miscellaneous items.

Application deadline is May 1. Places are subject to availability, so sign up early to avoid disappointment!
