What is Phonics?

Phonics

- Learning to listen
- Learning the 44 phonemes of the English language, in sound and written form
- Applying knowledge of sounds to read and write simple words and captions
- Learning spelling rules

What is Phonics?

Blending

The skill of combining sounds to read words and sentences.

Segmenting

The skill of separating sounds in a word in order to write.



Letters and Sounds

- We follow the UK Curriculum <u>Letters and Sounds</u> phonics scheme.
- Consists of 6 Phases
 - <u>Phase 1</u> (Teddies) Learning to listen and identify sounds around them, playing with sounds.
 - Phase 2 (Teddies/Nursery/Reception)— Identifying the first 19 phonemes and using them to read and write simple words.
 - Phase 3 (Reception) Identifying the next 25 graphemes and using them to read and write simple words and captions.
 - Phase 4 (Reception/Year 1) Consolidation phase learning skills to read multisyllable words and words with adjacent consonants (string, trap)
 - Phase 5 (Year 1/Year 2) Learning final graphemes, alternate spellings of sounds and identifying spelling patterns.
 - Phase 6 (Year 2/Year 3) Develop fluency when reading and accurate spelling by learning spelling rules.

Letters and Sounds

Tricky Words

- Words that can't be decoded using phonics strategies
- Each Letters and Sounds Phase contains a list of Tricky Words and High Frequency Words that children will learn
- Children find tricky words challenging
- Repetition and memory need to learn tricky words
- Tricky words will be sent home in Reception and the end of Nursery please practice each time you read with your child.



Carpet-Time

- In Teddies, phonics is spontaneously developed through play, songs, stories and rhyme.
- In Nursery, children take part in a 10 minute phonics session daily and apply their skills in play.
- In Reception, children take part in a 15-20 minute phonics session daily and apply their skills through adult-directed tasks and play activities.
- Ability setting when ready to allow children's needs to be met.

Lesson Structure

- Revisit (3-5 minutes) Recap of previously taught sounds using flashcards or quickwriting sounds.
- Teach (5 minutes) Teach a new sound or skill learn to write sound, form letters
 correctly and learn actions for each sound. Learn a new tricky word.
- Practise (5 minutes) Practise the new sound by reading or writing simple words or playing a game involving the sound.
- Apply (5 7 minutes) Apply the new sound or skill to read and write words or captions.

Schemes

Jolly Phonics Actions – We use Jolly Phonics actions to help children remember each sound. Children will learn these songs and actions when they learn a new sound.

Read Write Inc Letter Formation – We use Read Write Inc letter formation to teach children how to form letters correctly. They learn this vocabulary when they initially learn the sound and it is consistently used in their play to reinforce letter formation.

Phonics in Play

- Phonics-based activities are all around.
- Children regularly access phonics activities in their play and teachers extend their learning.
