TEACHING & LEARNING IN SCHOOL

It is lovely to be back in school and the sound of children learning, engaging and loving being here is wonderful to hear around the place.

Our approach to teaching and learning continues to be a theme-based curriculum this year. We follow the principles of the English National Curriculum & Early Years Framework but engage, excite and inspire by linking all of the subjects and development matters, where possible, to a theme. This term examples of some of the themes include:

- Around the world in 80 days – Year 4
- Ancient Egypt – Year 3
- All about me – Pre-Nursery & Nursery
- From A to B – Year 2
- Fairgrounds – Year 6
- Dinosaurs – Reception

Some subjects are still taught discreetly most of the time eg maths and science, but where possible we tie it all in together. Our specialist teachers have been working hard to link the topic to their specialist subject area too. This approach to teaching and learning enables the children to become absorbed in learning and provides the hook needed to engage. Ask your child if they know what theme or topic they are doing this term. If they don't know yet, it will be a matter of days until they are certain of what their theme is in class!



Overarching all of this is our High Performance Learning approach. We have high expectations of all of the children in our school and help them to learn the attitudes, behaviours and values needed to learn effectively.

This promises to be an exciting term and I can't wait to see all of the wonderful work and performances the children will create.

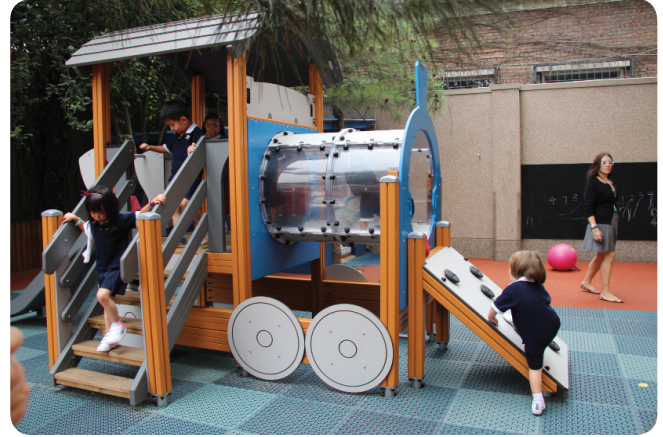
