• World Water Day

Friday 21 March – World Water Day is approaching. We will be celebrating the vital resource of 'water' on Friday through lessons and activities designed to inspire and inform about many different aspect of water. We hope to raise money for Water Aid (http://www.wateraid.org/) as we did last year through pupils designing and painting (on their own faces, hands, arms etc) water inspired images. Face paints will be available at school or this can be done at home. Hopefully all children can donate 10rmb to our cause.



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Literacy

In Literacy, the children will continue to work on Little Red Riding Hood. They will be focusing first on writing story openings using either: action, dialogue, character or setting and then concentrating on how to write a strong ending.

Phonics

In phonics this week we will review how to add the suffixes *er* and *est* correctly to words. We will also revisit how to use the following suffixes: *ful, ness* and *ment*. The children will learn the spelling rules that apply to the suffixes when adding them to words. The children will also learn to write sentences containing these suffixes correctly.

Key words: happiness, emptiness, greatness, beautiful, plentiful, careful, payment, movement, development, advertisement

This week, Puffer Fish will learn how to use the suffix ed. We will learn and prcatise spelling common words like *jumped, cried, wanted, lived, liked* and *pulled*. We will also practice polysyllabic words like *dragon, morning, granddad* and *narrator*.

Key words: cried, tried, spied, wanted, pulled, punched, lived, mimed, tripped & hopped.

This week starfish will be focusing on the sounds *aw* and *ue*. These are long vowel sounds. We will be looking at them in our reading and using them to write sentences. **Key words:** jaw, shawl, paw, claw, drawer, saw, blue, glue, argue, cue

Octopus phonics group will be learning the alternative pronunciation and spellings for *u* and *ear*. We will be focusing on the words nut, fun, sun, done, some, come, ear, fear, near, career and steering. We will also be practising the reading and spelling of the high frequency words Mr, Mrs, took and home.

Key words: fun, sun, done, some, come, ear, fear, near, career, steering

This week, Stingrays will recap phase 3 sounds. We will review all sound covered so far in phase 3 and recap the first 100 words.

Key words: the, that, then, come, back, from, little, made, just, help

This week Sharks will be reviewing high frequency words such as eat, everyone, our. Later in the week they will be introduced to the alternative spelling of 'ee' as in bee, sea, least, field. **Word list:** streaming, repeated, complete, theme, least, everyone, meet, sea, seat, relief, thief.

Jellyfish will learn spellings of words containing the letter 'a'. We will explore how 'a' has different sounds in different words. For example the 'a' sound as in cat, the 'ai' sound as in 'apron' and the 'o' sound as in 'wash'.

Key words: last, acorn, watch, baby, apricot, squash, native, angel, wasp, what

Maths

This week is Maths Week. The children will be doing lots of exciting activities including an problem solving day on Thursday and year 6 will be visiting us with Maths games on Friday.

We will be, however, also continuing with our Maths lessons through the week.

Some children will be adding and subtracting a multiple of 10 from a 2-digit number by counting back in 10s. Children will be able to use a hundred square or number line to support them with their counting. Once children are comfortable adding and subtracting a multiple of 10 we will

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teach children how to add and subtract 9 and 11 mentally by first adding or subtracting 10 and then adding or subtracting one more. We will then look at adding and subtracting 19 and 21 by adding and subtracting 20 first then adjusting.

Another group of children will be revising how to count on in 25, 55 or 105. We are then going to review recognizing odd and even numbers. Once the children are comfortable counting in 25, 55 or 105 we will introduce the idea of multiplication as 'lots of'. We will do lots of practical activities to help the children understand the concept of multiplication and then we will start to use the × sign to write multiplication number sentences.

Finally some children will consolidate their understanding of multiplication as repeated addition. They will use arrays to help them solve simple multiplication problems. The multiplication facts we will be focusing on are the 2s, 5,s and 1os.

Themed Learning

Themed Learning covers our Science, Humanities and Art sessions. Teachers will be adopting a themed learning approach on a weekly or biweekly basis to allow for a more creative, cross-curricular approach to learning.

Our topic until Easter holidays will be "Planes, Trains and Automobiles", which will focus on inventions. This will be an inquiry based topic led, which will build on what the children already know and what they wonder and questions they would like to answer.

Humanities

The children will be finding out about the invention of a different mode of transport. They will be looking at how this invention has changed and reasons why people have changed the train or the plane. They will be culminating the next two weeks by looking at whether the invention of these ways of getting around have been a positive thing, negative thing or whether there are both good and bad points about this invention.

PSHCE

In PSHCE we will be looking at e safety and how this is important in our modern day lives. Children will be made aware of issues that can arise using computers and the internet and how they can stay safe. We will use a range of tools to show children how dangers can be averted and how trust is a very difficult thing online.

Themed Learning – invent, invention, problem, solution, positive, negative, change, successful **HPL** –connection finding, intellectual confidence, fluent thinking, collaboration, practice, speed and accuracy, risk taking
