### Early Years

Young children are able to learn new knowledge and skills at an amazing rate. All students in Nursery and Reception are in the process of learning how to communicate, whether this be in English, or another native language. The role of the EAL programme in EYFS is to complement this learning in English. Dedicated Early Years EAL teachers take small groups of children out of the mainstream classroom (EAL extraction) and, using an exciting curriculum involving games, songs, and other age-appropriate techniques, they lead the children in developing their speaking, listening, vocabulary, and phonics (letters & sounds) abilities.

The EAL department also works extremely closely with mainstream teachers, helping to plan and deliver appropriate English instruction within the mainstream classroom (EAL in-class support). The students, armed with their new English skills, are rapidly able to participate alongside their classmates, in the broader study of communication skills, reading, writing, and learning in English that are developing in all children at this age. It is an absolute delight to observe many young children who enter the EAL programme with no English ability playing with their friends and actively participating in school in English after just a few months. Children who graduate the EYFS EAL programme have the opportunity to develop their English skills in school in exactly the same way as native-speaking children, as their education progresses.
