Literacy

In Literacy we will be learning about poetry in the context of Chinese New Year. The children will be investigating shape and acrostic poems to do with the departing snake, and the incoming horse.

Jellyfish – digraph review
Sharks – u and ow

Maths

In Maths we will review some topics that have been touched on in the last term, in particular reading and using three digit numbers, recalling number facts at speed and counting in steps.

Themed Learning

Themed Learning covers our Science, Humanities and Art sessions. Teachers will be adopting a themed learning approach on a weekly or biweekly basis to allow for a more creative, cross-curricular approach to learning. Teachers may highlight specific Science, Humanities and Art skills being covered each week, but generally will provide an overview for the learning block.

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Science

In Science we will continue our topic on 'Materials'. This week children will continue to explore different materials and will think about how to sort and classify different materials.

Humanities

In Humanities we will continue our topic on 'Houses and Homes'. This week children will be learning about different spaces in different homes and thinking about why we use different parts of our homes for various activities.

PSHCE

In PSHCE we will continue our topic 'Going for Goals'. This week children will continue to think about their goals and create a wish for a goal in the Year of the Horse.

Vocabulary

Literacy - rhyme, rhyming string, root, poem, nursery rhyme.

Maths – doubling, near doubles, add again, addition, subtraction.

Science – materials, bendy, shiny, soft, dull, hard, flexible, scratchy, coarse, rough, smooth, bumpy, stiff.

Humanities – kitchen, bathroom, bedroom, playroom, study, hall, living room, dining room, cellar, attic.
