On Monday, the year 4 Herons and Kingfishers went on a wild trip to Beijing Zoo! As part of their current topic, The Planeteers, the children have been exploring and discussing artificial habitats and how well they cater to the needs of different kinds of animals. Kitted out with clipboards and cameras, they set out to apply their knowledge of animal habitats to discover and record which man-made enclosures at Beijing zoo rose to the challenge.



The children found a variety of enclosures, some more suitable than others. The children were delighted to see the monkeys playing socially in a large area with lots of equipment for them to play and exercise on to keep them well. They decided that this enclosure had been well planned out to cater for the specific needs of the monkeys. However, the elephants were cramped into small cages where they had no room to exercise and no opportunities to socialise. The children were very mature and objective with their points of view and the way they expressed their comments.

WHAT DO CHILDREN LEARN FROM NURSERY RHYMES?

- Nursery Rhymes are an engaging and playful way for young children to hear, identify, manipulate, and experiment with the sounds of language.

- Nursery Rhymes explore words that describe size, weight, and use math related words to define concepts. They also often include counting sequences which help develop maths skills that children will use later to begin to add and subtract.

- Children simultaneously practice pitch, volume, and voice inflection while experiencing the rhythm of language.

- Children learn to pronounce words easily by saying them over and over again and by practicing them without effort.

- Nursery Rhymes promote positive attitudes towards language learning and help children to build an awareness of the sound patterns of language, especially rhyming words.

- Rhymes expose children to story sequences, helping them identify what happened first, next and last.
