CHANGES TO THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR By Lisa Milanec, Principal

Each year as our doors close for the holidays there are always a number of jobs that need to be done across the school to try and improve our provision as much as possible. Last year of course we went through a major expansion of the building and fortunately there will be nothing quite as dramatic occurring this summer. However, there will be some projects taking place which we are happy to inform you of:

- An additional classroom in the Early Years building; we have been fortunate to acquire some more space in the Early Years building and therefore we will be creating more space on the 1st floor of the building for our youngest students.
- The Primary Campus playground will be resurfaced and remarked over the holidays so the children will have a brighter playground to play on when they return.
- Further improvements to our air quality provision will be made to both buildings. This will involve the addition of further purifying equipment in classes and shared areas. The project will begin in the holidays but will likely need to continue throughout the autumn term (outside of school hours).

CHANGES TO TEACHING AND LEARNING

As many of you know we will be further embedding our thematic approach to learning next year which allows students to learn the key skills and objectives for various subjects within the context of an overarching theme or topic. This has proved very successful this year and we have received many positive comments from our parents about this approach. You will have received information about your child's topics for the upcoming year and we will most certainly be providing you with opportunties to come and share your child's learning throughout the year.

We have made a change to the current Music programme for next year. From August we will be removing the Primary Instrumental Programme which was delivered to children in Years 1 to 6, and instead we will be introducing a Choral Music Programme for students in Reception through to Year 6. There were several factors that supported us in making this decision and we also consulted with parents during our recent Focus Groups on the issue. Whilst the students will not receive the class based intrumental lesson, they will still have access to the range of musical instruments through their weekly music lesson and students will still have the opportunity to take individual music lessons through our IMPs programme.

Our Choral Music Programme will be led by Ms. Iva Borisavljevic. We are very excited about the many musical performances we will be able to showcase next year, both instrumental and choral.
