ENGLISH

This week, we will continue to read the book 'The Cat who wanted to go home'.

The children have created story maps and have started to plan out their ideas.

In their writing, the children will think about how to plan their story; write down ideas trying to use new vocabulary; check that they have used correct spellings, punctuation and grammar; and edit their story to make improvements.



MATHEMATICS

In their maths the students will:

count in steps of 2 and 5 from 0 and in tens from any number, forward and backward.

recognise the place value of each digit in a two-digit number (tens. ones)

identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations, including the number line

compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use <, > and = signs

read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals use place value and number facts to solve problems



TOPIC

From A to B

This week we will ask the children to think about their most recent experience of going on holiday. Did they travel to a different place in China? Or did they travel to a different country?

The children will use maps, atlases and globes to trace their journeys and use words and pictures to record their responses to different questions, such as - Was the destination hotter or colder than where they live? What was the reason for visiting? How did they get there? Did they like that form of transport?

On Tuesday we are lucky enough to have a guest speaker coming into school to talk about his job as a shipbuilder. We can't wait!
