Are you considering a career in Journalism?

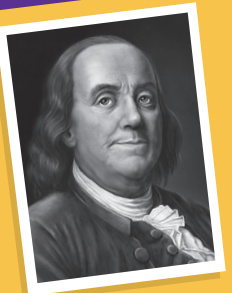
