We will then collect this all together and make the donation through the authorized channels.

This will be completed over the summer break. We have also purchased more plants to improve the natural environment around the school.

to research, design and create their own learning in a manner that compliments traditional teaching within the classroom. The devices can also help with planning and organization and students can have full access to Moodle and Global classroom, giving them power at their fingertips. This trial has caused quite a commotion in the school, with other Year Groups desperate now to become involved. The excitement and buzz about the trial is evidence that students can be excited about learning. Technology is a vital part of our society and we want to harness its potential to help students achieve great results.
