An Introduction to (I)GCSEs

- (International) General Certificate of Secondary Education
- Set by UK examination boards
- Overseen by the UK government
- Taken by almost all students in the UK
- Recognised worldwide

What is Success?

- It depends on the student
- Targets are personalised
- UK measure: minimum target is 5 A*- C including English, Maths and Science
- Some subjects 9-1 grading

2017 Results

• 59% A* - A grades

- If not, seek advice from your teacher. We are here to enable you to achieve success




What We Expect from our Students
