
- Thank you to all those who came to the Phonics Show case last Thursday. We

Learning Theme

As we are lucky enough to have the author Neil Griffiths visiting us this week we wanted to look really closely at some of his wonderful books. We want the children to foster a love of books and reading and will be sharing lots of different stories with the children throughout the week and learning about the different parts of a book too!





Key Vocabulary: book, story, cover, title, author


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
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Literacy: The children we be exploring lots of different stories and looking at books all week. Each class will look really closely at one book in particular and talk about the *characters*, and where the story is happening- its *setting*. We will talk about the beginning, middle and end of the story and think about how we can re tell the story. The children will be deciding what props they might need to make a *story bag* for their book which they will be able to use to tell the story as they become more familiar with it.

Key Vocabulary: story, characters, setting, beginning, middle, end, props, re-tell.

Phonics

The children will have lots of opportunities this week to explore and play with words as we read and talk about the stories we are focusing on. We will continue to play games and incorporate elements of sound discrimination, alliteration and rhyme into our daily activities as well as our small group focused activities. Some children will be listening for initial sounds of familiar words and some will be reviewing the single sounds they have met so far.

Following our Showcase last week we will be sending information home which will give more detail about the phonics in the third term and also the reading books that will be sent home.

Mathematics: We will be using the story books as a stimulus this week, they have such lovely illustrations that the opportunity to count animals on a page, compare the sizes of different characters, talk about shapes that the children can see in the pictures is an opportunity to explore mathematics in the environment with the children.

Key Vocabulary: number, count, how many, size, compare, shape

Personal Social and Emotional Development: The themes in many stories for Nursery age children is often cantered on sharing, turn taking, being kind and polite and also how we are similar and the same. Stories are always a great was to talk about these ideas with children and in our small group work as we talk about the characters and what they do we will be exploring these key personal and social skills with the children. They will also need to co-operate and work together to make their story sack props!

Key Vocabulary: share, kind, work together

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Expressive Design and Art: We will be using the stories to inspire the children to create their own illustrations. Through the continuous provision they will be invited to build, make, collage, draw and paint in response to the stories they hear and we read together. And we will of course be making our own props, the children will be deciding what they need to make to re tell their stories and we will be supporting them in their creativity, wherever that may lead!

Key Vocabulary: cut, stick, glue, join, paint, colours, puppet,

Understanding the World: Our potatoes haven't grown too much yet, so we'll need to check this week too! The children have access to computers each day and a range of appropriate programs that they can access freely. And, again we will use the stories we read to think about how places and environments can be different.

Key Vocabulary: place, country, the same, different

Mandarin

We will focus on stories next week. These stories are "My dad" "xiaohuan and xiao lan" and "Mike who loved music". Throught these stories, we will learn some instruments ,review some colours and numbers. We also will play some games called "listen and guess"

Key Vocabulary: guitar 吉他(ji ta) piano 钢琴(gang qin)violin 小提(xiao ti qin)flute 笛子 (di zi). thanks
