Korean Language Options gr 6-8

- We are ready to offer Korean Language and Literature in gr 6-8
- Students who are in EAL currently must remain in the modified programme until they exit
- If a student is exited from EAL, he/she may consider taking Korean or Chinese
- Grade 8 excepted as the EAL support will take place during Enrichment



Language Options

- Language are offered as either Language and Literature or as Language Acquisition
- All students must study at least one Language and Literature course and be strong in this language
- All students must study English either as a Language and Literature course or as a Language Acquisition course
- LIS is now offering a Korean Language and Literature course
- Your choice as parents is between Korean Language and Literature, Chinese Acquisition or French Acquisition



Contents: What does the Diploma Programme curriculum contain?

The curriculum contains six subject groups and a core of three parts.



Students study concurrently:

- three subjects at higher level
- three subjects at standard level all three parts of the core:
- Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay, CAS

Standard Level or Higher Level

- Standard Level courses and Higher Level courses
- Same core content and assessment
- Difference in hours and depth of content
- Standard Level=150 hours
- Higher Level= 240 hours
- Higher Level should be your stronger courses



Subjects offered: What subjects are offered within the six groups?

 - History HL or SL
 - online courses(see group 6)

- Information technology in a global society SL

MYP Language B_(acquisition) > DP Language B

- Language B Standard Level: achievement of 4+ or strong performance in the Intermediate or 3-4
- summer language work is recommended if a student is in Lower Intermediate

- Diploma Language B Higher Level: phase 3-4 with a strong performance
- See your language and literature teacher + acquisition teachers for guidance and Mr Saulnier, Languages Coordinator

Language A and B

Language A:

- Mother tongue
- The school's language of instruction (English)
- Proficient level

Language B:

- •A second language not the student's mother tongue (English, Chinese (Chinese ab initio for students with limited experience of Chinese, French or an option for online Spanish ab initio
- •Ab initio means from the beginning) Ab initio
- •Phase 3-4 for SL; 4 is better

Full Diploma or Certificates?

- Full Diploma> 24/45 to be eligible
- 42 points from 6 courses out of graded out of 7 each
- 3 extra points can be earned for performance in the Core Components below (EE +TOK)
- Complete Extended Essay (EE)
- Theory of Knowledge (ToK) above an Elementary
- Complete Creativity, Activity and Service



DP Certificates/DP Course Options

- Certificates: sit exams in each subject and earn a 2
- Only SL courses required
- No Extended Essay or Theory of Knowledge
- •CAS a LIS requirement so it IS required with certificates
- Still can gain good university entrance



Online Diploma Course?

- Provided by Pamoja Education Services
- Independent online learning
- Classmates from around the world
- Teacher can be in a different time zone
- Live sessions available
- Students must be good at time management
- Commit to being independent
- Commit to seek support from Coordinator



Contents: Core of the Diploma Programme

There are three core requirements

The Extended Essay:

- 4,000 words
- Offers the opportunity to investigate a research question of individual interest
- Familiarises students with the independent research and writing skills expected at university





Diploma Programme Creativity, Activity and Service

Creativity, activity and service (CAS):

- Encourages students to be involved in artistic pursuits, sports and community service
- Education outside the classroom: gr
 11 March CAS trip to Shangri-La
- Development of the IB learner profile
- Required to be eligible for the Diploma





Contents: Theory of Knowledge Course

- Interdisciplinary
- Explores the nature of knowledge across disciplines
- Encouraging an appreciation of other cultural perspectives
- Can lead to additional Diploma points
- EE and TOK can add up to 3 points

DP points and the Global Standard?

- 4+ from grade 10 to take higher level courses
- Straight 5's (29 points-over 30 to be safe) average conditional offer from UK (IB Schools and Colleges Associations of the UK)
- Competitive is 40-45
- 30 points University of Toronto –Arts Programme
- 34-36 points some engineering programmes
- 31- 33 points 10 year average to gain entrance to solid university programmes
- Korean Universities have a high standard 35-40
- Need to consider how long you have been out of Korea
- Do your own research per institution
- Speak to Mrs Mindorff; do own research

University Applications

- Visit universities summer gr 10-11
- Non-English speakers should take IELTS(academic) or TOEFL
- Use Naviance (starting in January of gr 10)
- Best fit for you and your child
- Region, country, requirements, programme of study
- Korean Universities: very competitive 35-40's range depending on university
- SAT often required
- Authentication process
- Agents: we do not share school documents
