Trip Itinerary

Sept 16. Chengdu - Kangding (flight)

Take a morning flight from Chengdu to the Tibetan plateau, landing at the third highest airport in the world (4280m). The airport is surrounded by the iconic, sweeping, green rolling hills of the plateau. After a beautiful, scenic descent from the airport to Kangding (elev. 2600m), you find yourself deep in the mountains that guard the approach to the Tibet-Qinghai plateau. You pass through a virtual time warp on such a short journey. Everything becomes new: landscape, climate, cuisine, language, customs, and of course, the people. Lunch will be had in Kangding, followed by walking up to Baitukan (the village above town where the hostel is located) to settle into the hostel and explore the village. Visit Running Horse mountain in the afternoon for scenic views of the Kangding valley. On the first evening you'll visit Ngachu monastery on the way to dinner, followed by a community dance (feel free to join in!).

Sept 17. Kangding.

The first thing you notice on this morning's trek is that everywhere you look goes up! Kangding is perched on the edge of the Tibet-Qinghai plateau. A half day trek to the top of Kangding grasslands for a scenic view of the city will follow breakfast. Picnic and games will be enjoyed at the top. Visit Dordrak Monastery on the way back down for an introduction to the Tibetan Buddhist worldview. A local dinner will be enjoyed back in town before relaxing and playing games back at the hostel.

Accommodation: Zhilam Hostel, Kangding

Sept. 18. Kangding - Tagong.

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This morning is up, up, up, ... and over the Zheduo Mountain pass (4200m) to the renowned nomadic trading village of Tagong (2.5 hr drive, 3700m). Weather permitting, you'll see the peak of Gong-ga Mountain (7566m) along the way - the highest peak in China outside of the Himalayas. This high altitude grassland area is home to many nomadic families who spend their days herding yaks. You will spend a half-day with 30 young

students (7-12 yrs old) from the local school playing games, doing a small environmental clean-up project, and donating a practical gift of food. There is a small business in this nomadic trading town called the Khampa Cafe that seeks to help local artisans with marketing their handicrafts. Students will have an introduction to this small business, before proceeding out of town to their quaint accommodation for the night: a homestay operated by an American woman married to a local Tibetan. Students will see first hand what it looks like to live off the grid using completely renewable resources to power a home. Accommodation: Angela's Homestay, Tagong

Sept 19. Kangding to Chengdu (bus)

Dare yourself to wake up with the sun and walk to a nearby hilltop for views of the valley! Departing after breakfast, you will retrace your journey back through Kangding, and returning to Chengdu by mid afternoon (approx 9hr bus ride). Students will be dropped off at Leman by approx 5pm.

Trip Concludes on return to Leman (approx 5pm).
