# Trip Itinerary

## Sep 16: Chengdu to Se'ergu Village

Departing from Chengdu today, you will make the 4.5 hr drive to the very small and local farming village of Se'ergu. The afternoon will be spent exploring the area, trekking to the village lookout, and offering an hour or two of labor in the fields of the local farmers. Over dinner students will hear a brief history of the village and description of the daily lifestyle. After dinner, students will have an opportunity to practice their fire starting skills in preparation for the evening fireside. Hot chocolate and roasting marshmallows is compulsory at every fireside!

### Sep 17: Heishui

After breakfast this morning, the students will break camp and head to Heishui to visit the local monastery where they will be introduced to the Tibetan Buddhist worldview. They will then settle in to this nights accommodations before





heading for a chinese style dinner. Following dinner, they will learn some new dance moves by taking part in the nightly community dance at the town square.

## Sep 18: Dagu Glacier Park

Today, students will spend the morning at Dagu Glacier Park. A gondola ride will take them to the top, measuring in at 4,800m in elevation. Lunch will be enjoyed at a local Tibetan village guesthouse where the Tibetan family will share about the lifestyle differences between the past and present, answering any questions the students may have. Returning to hotel before dinner, the students will have some free time as they may be exhausted after the trip to higher elevation. Tibetan dancing will follow Tibetan dinner this evening.

## Sept 19. Return to Chengdu.

Today marks the end of the trip as you drive back to Chengdu. Departing from Heishui after breakfast, you will stop in Maoxian for lunch, and back in the city by mid afternoon.
