- Handout with song words (if needed)

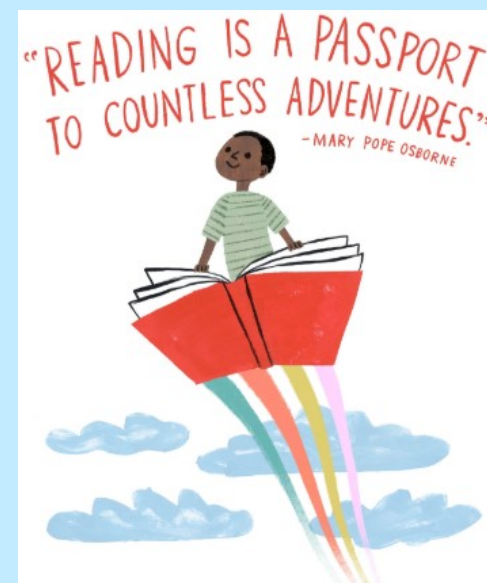
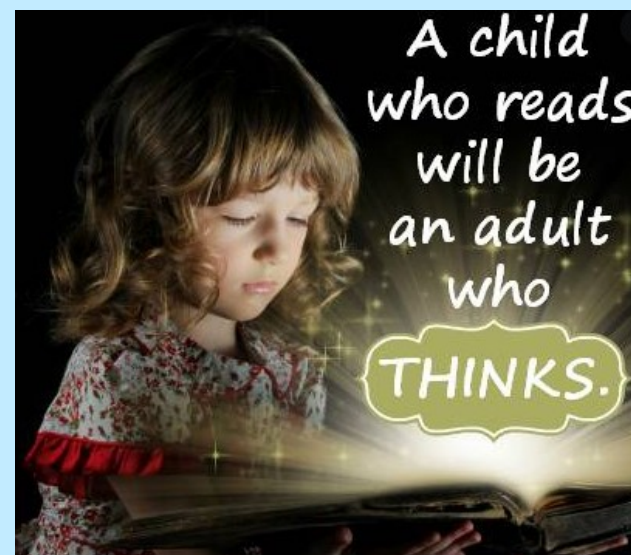


Books, Books, Books!

Ideas to try at home

Pom Pom Avalanche

Trap pom poms in a colander using wooden sticks or pipe cleaners and turn it upside down. Let the children take turns to pull the sticks out (and strengthen their fine motor skills) until all of the pom poms fall down like an avalanche.

What you need—

- Around 50 coloured pom poms
- Wooden sticks or Pipe Cleaners
- A large colander



Memory Game

Take several paper plates and markers or pictures. Draw shapes, animals, numbers or anything else that interests your child. Take it in turns to turn over two plates. Can you find a matching pair?

What you need—

- Paper Plates
- Pens or printed pictures



DIY Telephone

Paint or decorate some plastic cups. Poke a hole in each of them and thread string through the bottom. Whisper to each other and pass different messages around.

What you need—

- Plastic Cups
- String
- Paint or other things to decorate the cups.



Story Stones

Story stones are simple prompts for retelling stories or creating your own using your imagination. All you need to do is get some flat and smooth stones from a craft shop or a beach and decorate them with pictures of objects or animals. Choose one of the stones and start a story based on the picture on it, add more stones and continue the story.

What you need—

- Small stones
- Stickers or paper to make pictures.
