Trip Itinerary

Sept 15. Chengdu to Shangri-la (flight)

Today you will meet at the airport for your afternoon flight to another world in Shangri-la. At 3100m, everything becomes new: landscape, climate, cuisine, language, customs, and of course, the people. A late, Tibetan-style dinner will follow an evening check in at the quaint Bodhi Inn, in the old town of fabled Shangri-la! Accommodation: Bodhi Inn, Shangri-la

Sept 16. Shangri-la

Enjoy a tour of the old town after breakfast to appreciate the beauty and uniqueness of this fabled town. Mid-morning you'll take a 1hr drive to the countryside to prepare for an afternoon trek to your campsite for the evening. After lunch, you'll strap on your backpack for the 4km light trek to the river valley where you'll set up camp for the night. Enjoy an evening mixed with camp craft activities like fire starting, and





games and activities, followed by fireside time and hot chocolate!

Accommodation: Camping, Shangri-la

Sept 17. Local Farming Practices

This morning you will pack up, clean up the camp site, and head into the village for lunch with a local host family. You will learn about local farming methods and assist with some manual labor (community help) on the farm. Be sure to wash the dirt off your hands when you return to your hotel in the afternoon! Dinner in town will be followed by gathering with the locals for a community dance at the town square (feel free to join in!). Accommodation: Bodhi Inn, Shangri-la

Sept 18. Songzanlin Monastery

After breakfast, you will visit Songzanlin monastery for an introduction to monastery life and local monastic history. After a late lunch with a local Tibetan family, you will visit the Thangka painting center for an introduction to basic Thangka

painting techniques. You will have fun trying them out yourselves. Dinner and the opportunity to practice your dance moves from the night before in the square will fill your evening before heading back to your hotel.

Sept 19. Shangri-la to Chengdu (flight)

On the morning of your final day you will visit the Shangri-la Museum. After lunch, your final tour will be of the Shangrila Handicraft Centre, for an introduction to local poverty alleviation projects. You will then head to the airport for a late afternoon flight. Landing back in Chengdu in the evening, you will bus back to LIS for a late evening arrival.
