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Where did it all begin?

At the beginning of FS2, some children could...

- Recognise and write some letters in their play
- Recognise and write their own name
- Read simple words


What do we expect to see by the end of FS2?

- They write simple sentences which can be read by themselves and others.
- They also write some irregular common words.
- Some words are spelt correctly and others are phonetically plausible.

• Show an understanding of punctuation – capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
































































Phonics-Song of Sounds

Song of Sounds is a multisensory approach to learning phonics.

We teach each sound through a song with a matching picture and action. Children then associate the sound with the picture and letter and eventually with just the letter.

When children are confident with the single letter sounds, we then teach the remaining sounds which are made up of 2 or 3 letters.

Supporting Writing

- Model segmenting a word with children, over emphasising sounds when necessary. Encourage children to use their sound mat.
- Encourage children to count the sounds they can hear in a word. E.g. h-a-t has 3 sounds. E.g. sh-ee-p also has 3 sounds.
- When they are ready to write more than one word, encourage them to count how many words are in a sentence.
- Ask "Which hidden sounds can you hear?" "What tricky words are in the sentence?"
- Say the sentence in different ways.

Spelling

Children will be taught sounds in a specific order and we encourage children to write phonetically, rather than focusing on the correct spelling. For example one of the first diagraphs taught is 'ay'.

This is not saying children can not and should not be corrected and taught the correct spellings when they are ready. Children will begin to learn simple spelling rules towards the end of FS2.
