Introduction



Expedition Programme

Your child's stay in Tanzania will include opportunities for them to participate in community service, cultural exchanges and a safari at Tarangire National Park. At the end of each day, your child will have a chance to debrief, reflect and plan for the following day. Read about the exciting activities we have lined up for your child in this example itinerary.

Arrival

Day 1 After arriving at Kilimanjaro airport the group will transfer to Shamba Kipara Camp for an introduction talk and camp site tour. Students will then spend the rest of the day relaxing - settling into their new environment with free time to explore the camp.



Village Tour and Community Service

Day 2 Half day walk and curricular study of the local area followed by half a day of community service work, which could include building goat sheds, installing solar power systems and smokeless stoves, establishing rainwater collection systems or renovating buildings.

Community Service at the Seeway Children's Centre

Day 3 Full day continuation of the community project and time spent at Seeway Children's Centre, a home for children who have suffered abuse or who have lost their parents. Your child will help to build homes for these children so that they have a safe place to live and play.



Make an Impact

The Global Campus Social Citizenship Expedition in Arusha, Tanzania is a life-changing experience for our students. They will discover the diverse and vibrant culture of Tanzania and significantly contribute to local communities, whilst strengthening their own leadership and teamwork skills.

This expedition takes your child away from the beaten track. Working with students from Nord Anglia schools around the world, they will participate in sustainable development projects to support the improvement of a local community, including village construction projects and work in a primary school. Your child will then go on an educational safari through the Tarangire National Park, learning about the region's diverse flora and fauna.

We believe this is a truly rewarding opportunity for every child. Our students will make a significant impact on improving the lives of others while learning about different cultures and environments strengthening essential skills such as confidence, independence and a global perspective.

Students age 14-16 from all Nord Anglia schools are encouraged to apply. There will be expeditions running throughout the 2016 /17 academic year and your school's expedition leader will be able to advise on when they will be participating. Space is limited so please sign up early to avoid disappointment.

Community Service

Day 4 Service work at a local primary school will include improving the school environment and supporting infrastructure development. Your child will get to interact with local students and experience Tanzanian school life.



Continuation of Community Service

Day 5 A continuation of service projects at a local primary school along with a planning session on building sustainable communities.

Day one of safari in Tarangire National Park

Day 6 In one of the world's greatest concentrations of wildlife, your child will explore the natural beauty that Tanzania has to offer. Students will travel through the park in specialist off-road trucks with incredible views of the vast array of wildlife and stunning scenery.

Day 7 Continuing on their journey in the savannah, your child will have a chance to bond with other Nord Anglia students through group activities along with a group quiz and a celebration of their achievements this week.

Departure

Day 8 Depending on departure time, your child will take part in various activities. Each group will debrief and have a reflection session, followed by free time around the camp and souvenir shopping.





Your child's stay in Tanzania

Your child will be staying at Nord Anglia's dedicated expedition centre - Shamba Kipara Camp located at the base of Mount Meru. It is a comfortable venue that is safe, relaxing and perfect for your child to unwind and reflect on their day while getting to know fellow Nord Anglia students from our schools around the world.

During their free time, your child can lounge by the camp's swimming pool surrounded by a communal area overlooking a lush green garden. Avocado and mango trees shade the surrounding area where your child can find some respite from the Tanzanian heat.

Your child will share large, single-gender tents that are fitted with comfortable beds and plenty of storage space. The campsite also has separate male and female bathrooms with hot and cold running water, showers and western-style toilets. Most meals will be served in the dining tent, where students can feast on a fusion of traditional Tanzanian and western food.

What to Bring:

The kit that your child brings is extremely important and intended to keep your child safe and comfortable at all times. Your child will receive a detailed kit list and information pack when they apply for the expedition to enable you to shop early, including suggested vendors that are generally available in all regions where our schools operate.

Health and Safety

Your child's health, safety and welfare is our highest priority. Our activities are organised to very high standards with appropriate risk assessments, trained staff and robust procedures and support systems in place to ensure that your child can experience the expedition confidently and safely.

Your child will require various vaccinations depending on personal health history and the country you live in. An information pack with more specific details on health, safety and the overall programme will be given to each student upon submitting their application.

Fees:

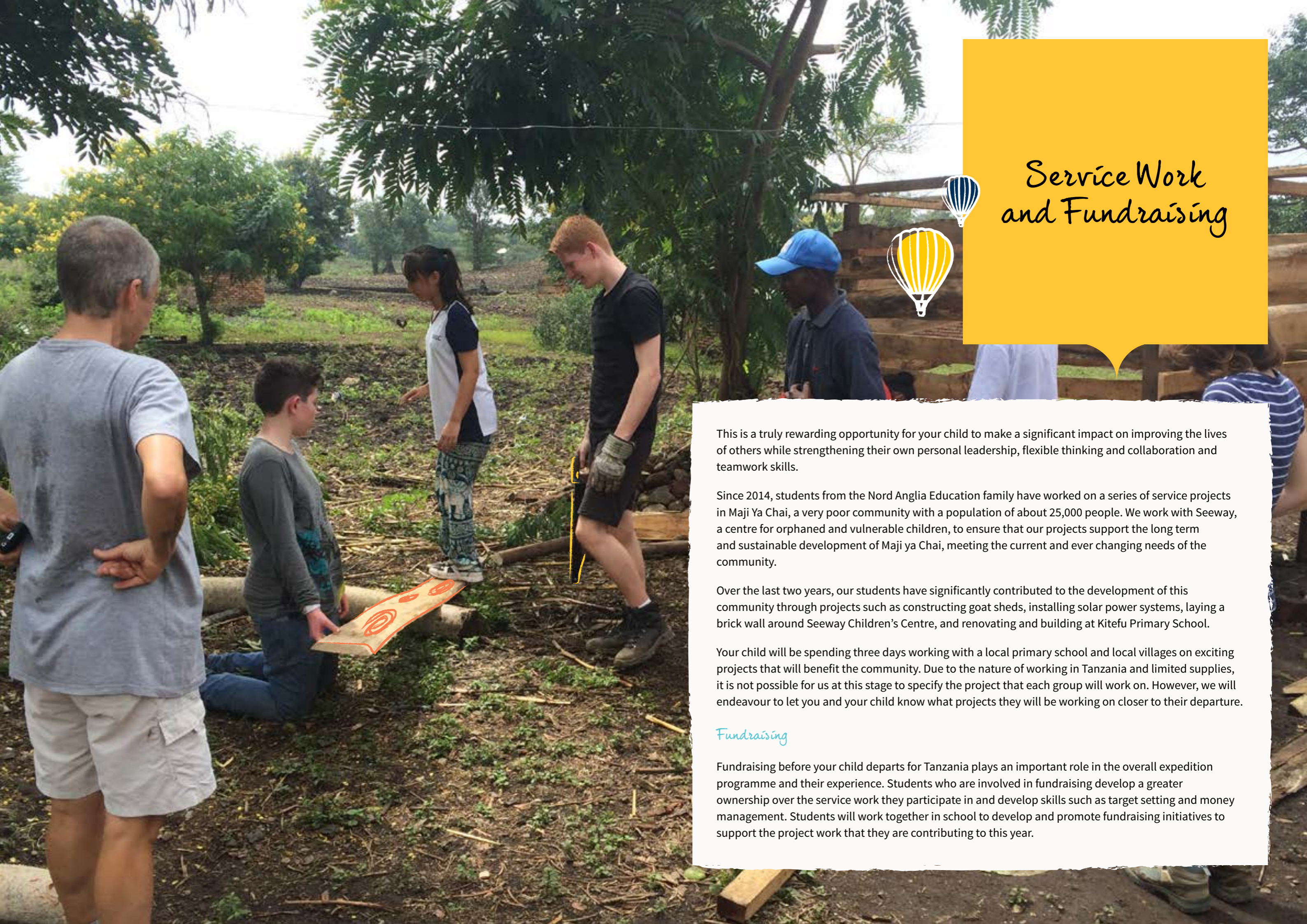
The expedition package offered by Nord Anglia Education includes all of your child's expenses while in Tanzania. This consists of all accommodation and food at Shamba Kipara Camp, a comfortable private camp only available to NAE students, as well as a one night camp while on the two day safari.

All in-country transport will be pre-arranged in private, safe vehicles, fully fitted with seat belts to ensure your child's safety.

In addition to this, please prepare for the following expenses arranged through the in-school Trip Organiser.

- Airfares to and from Tanzania from your country of residence
- Visas
- Travel and health insurances (the Trip Organiser will assist with this)
- Medication and Vaccinations
- Fundraising US \$300 to support service projects in Tanzania
- Money for souvenirs and additional snacks and drinks (we recommend no more than \$150)





Service Work and Fundraising

This is a truly rewarding opportunity for your child to make a significant impact on improving the lives of others while strengthening their own personal leadership, flexible thinking and collaboration and teamwork skills.

Since 2014, students from the Nord Anglia Education family have worked on a series of service projects in Maji Ya Chai, a very poor community with a population of about 25,000 people. We work with Seeway, a centre for orphaned and vulnerable children, to ensure that our projects support the long term and sustainable development of Maji ya Chai, meeting the current and ever changing needs of the community.

Over the last two years, our students have significantly contributed to the development of this community through projects such as constructing goat sheds, installing solar power systems, laying a brick wall around Seeway Children's Centre, and renovating and building at Kitefu Primary School.

Your child will be spending three days working with a local primary school and local villages on exciting projects that will benefit the community. Due to the nature of working in Tanzania and limited supplies, it is not possible for us at this stage to specify the project that each group will work on. However, we will endeavour to let you and your child know what projects they will be working on closer to their departure.

Fundraising

Fundraising before your child departs for Tanzania plays an important role in the overall expedition programme and their experience. Students who are involved in fundraising develop a greater ownership over the service work they participate in and develop skills such as target setting and money management. Students will work together in school to develop and promote fundraising initiatives to support the project work that they are contributing to this year.
