Who is the IBCP for?

- The IBCP was specifically developed for students who wish to engage in career-related learning while gaining **transferable** and **lifelong** skills in applied knowledge, critical thinking, communication, and cross-cultural engagement.
- The IBCP is a two-year programme for students in their last two years of their high school education.
- The IBCP allows students to gain an IB education with a more practical focus and flexibility.
- The IBCP opens a range of path ways (university, employment, apprenticeship).

Career-related studies at Collège du Léman

- **Hospitality** - introduces students to studies in hospitality and teaches the soft skills required in the workplace
- **Sustainability Management** - introduces students to studies in business with a focus on sustainability

Diploma Programme Courses

Students take a minimum of three IB Diploma Programme courses – selected for chosen profession

The Core components draw it together

Service Learning

The practical application of knowledge and skills toward meeting an identified community need. Students develop and apply personal and social skills in real-life situations involving decision-making, problem-solving, initiative, responsibility and accountability.

Reflective project

An in-depth body of work submitted toward the end of the programme. Students identify, analyze, discuss and evaluate an ethical dilemma associated with an issue from their career-related studies.

Personal and professional skills course

aims to develop responsibility, practical problem-solving, ethical understanding, perseverance, an appreciation of identity and perspective and an understanding of the complexity of the modern world.

Language development

ensures students have access and are exposed to a second language - a central tenet of an IB education and increases students' understanding of the wider world.
