Academic Initiatives



Learning English with the Accelerator Reader

The Accelerated Reader Program in CDL allows the students to enhance their skills in reading fluency and comprehension at different reading levels.

Students have the opportunity to read different genres at their own reading level and this makes it interesting for them to continue reading. They're able to find their reading level by doing a Star Reader quiz on the Accelerated Reader site. There are many books in the Accelerated Reader Program that are available in the library.

Students take a final quiz after reading a book. On the accelerated reader app on their iPads, students type in the quiz number or the name of the book. Then it brings up the quiz for the book, they've read. The quizzes for each book have a certain number of questions. If the students feel like the book or the quiz is too challenging for them and it's not at their level, they can move down a level. They are also able to move up a level if they have achieved their reading goal.

The Accelerated Reader Program has helped the Middle School Secondaire students in making consistent progress in their reading fluency and comprehension levels.
