

Dear parents and colleagues:

Following guidance from the World Health Organization and in the interest of protecting the safety and security of all our students, colleagues and families at San Roberto International School, we have taken the following precautionary measures:

- All families who wish to self- quarantine may have their children remain at home and distance learning will take place starting Tuesday March 17th until we receive additional indications from the Mexican authorities.
- The school will continue operating under the precautionary measures previously communicated and receiving students who attend school without any symptoms of concern.
- All ASOMEX events have been cancelled for the rest of this school year.
- All events involving travel are being cancelled and/or being rescheduled.
- All events involving parents and visitors have been cancelled until returning from Easter Break.

We ask you to act as a caring and responsible member of our community by informing the school:

If an immediate family member travels to a country currently listed by the U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC) as "**Warning Level 3: Reconsider Travel**" or "**Level 4: Do Not Travel**" (currently including China, Italy, Iran and South Korea), the family should, upon that individual's return to Mexico, voluntarily self-quarantine for a period of two weeks to ensure that they are virus free. [This list is updated on an ongoing basis and countries and regions may move on and off this list in the days, weeks and months ahead.]

These decisions were not taken lightly, we realize this is a challenging time and thank you for your understanding and support. More information will follow on the home learning provisions that are ready to begin with immediate effect.

Please know that we will keep in touch with you throughout.
