Learning Theme of the week

This week will be a finale to our minibeast topic. We will be making a big non fiction book about minibeasts encouraging children to consider which minibeast they will choose to focus on. They will have the opportunity to draw or paint their chosen creature, and research facts about their creature that they would like to include on their page.

Some of the main learning intentions taught and explored this week will be:

Communication, Language and Literacy

• Children will be introduced to non fiction books and we will be using these to find out facts about minibeasts. We will also be creating our own class big books of minibeasts which we look forward to sharing with other classes at the end of the week.

Key Vocabulary: non fiction books, information, illustration, writing, text.

Mathematics

- We will be continuing to explore shape and pattern, making arrangements with 2D and 3D shapes, and talking about the names and properties of different shapes.
- We will sing number songs and rhymes and play games to reinforce counting and numeral recognition skills.

Key Vocabulary: 2D shape, 3D shape, side, corner, triangle, circle, square, rectangle, pattern

Expressive arts and design

- We will be drawing and painting pictures of minibeasts for our big book.
- Children will have the opportunity to create their own minibeast from recycled materials.

Key Vocabulary: colour, shape, paint, draw, fix, attach, build, construct

Understanding the World

• The children have become very adept at hunting for minibeasts and we will be asking and answering questions about what they have observed.

Key Vocabulary: colour, shape, paint, draw, fix, attach, build, construct

Physical Development

• We will begin the week with sports day where the children will have fun showing off the skills they've been learning during their recent PE lessons. The emphasis is on taking part rather than competition and knowing that it is important to exercise to keep our bodies healthy.

Key Vocabulary: play, game, throw, catch, run, aim

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Phonics

We will be playing phonics games during carpet time and in groups to reinforce understanding of rhyme and alliteration. We will also be listening to the initial sounds in words, and for children that are ready, we will look at the letter shapes and corresponding letter sounds. (s,a,t,p,i,n)

Mandarin

We are going to talk about different sports next week, including skip the rope, jumping, running, playing football ,playing basketball. We will learn a new song which is called "Shi jie zhen mei hao (世界真美好)" We will do a worksheet which is called sports matching as well.

Key words: skip the rope (tiao sheng 跳绳) ,jumping (tiao 跳), running (pao bu 跑步),play football(ti zhu qiu 踢足球),play basketball (ti lan qiu 打篮球)

Dutch
