



## Curriculum Synopsis

The curriculum of Islamic Studies for year five focus on verses of the Qur'an, and the messages of the Prophet Muhammad (Hadith). It aims to give pupils a clear, thorough understanding of Islamic teachings, moral behavior and Islamic etiquette. Furthermore, it aims to give pupils a clear, thorough understanding of Islamic teachings, moral behavior and Islamic etiquette, and its contribution to modern science.

Some of the influential personalities in Islamic history are studied, such as the life of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), role models, values and ethics. Moreover, student's skills in Tajweed are developed through reading the Holy Qur'an.

The Islamic syllabus covers five main areas which are imparted to students in a continuous and a systematic way to support their understanding, enhance their reflective thinking.

For the second term the students will study the following topics:

- Surat Al-Ghasiyah (Divine Revelation):  
Students will start understanding how to do tafseer for the verses and link it with our daily life.
- Asunnan Ar-rawateb  
Distinguishes between the required prayer and the Sunnan and Rawateb.
- The migration to Abyssinia (The Prophet's biography):  
Our students will learn the Migration to Abyssinia and how this helps the early Muslims and the reasons for this migration.
- My Prayers (Islamic ruling)  
Students should know the purpose of sunnah salah and salah al jama'ah. Salah provides a means to ask and thank Allah for blessings. Salah is to act as a person's communication with God.
- Research and scientific thinking.  
Students will Employ scientific thinking in the search for knowledge.
- Year of sorrow.  
Students will know the events of the year of sorrow, and the impact of the death of Abu Talib and Khadija on our prophet Muhammad (PBUH).

## Supporting at Home

The support at home aims to document the student's relationship with the Holy Quran as the first source of knowledge, behavior, values, taste and beauty in order to build a Quranic mentality and psychology, by continuing to read the Qur'an and considering the provisions of intonation (*tajweed*).

One of the key elements of this support is to implant the love of Prophet Muhammad "peace be upon him" in the heart of the student through the experience of the Prophet's biography, and to highlight the life of the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) as a good example and a role-model to follow.
