Dates of expedition: November 3rd to November 12th 2019

Participants

- a select group of 24 NISC students ranging from Grade 8 to 10 (Academic year 2019-2020)
- Three Northbridge teachers will accompany the group

Requirements

- Parents must attend **all required meetings** prior to the trip.
- All documentation must be filled out by given deadlines (failure to complete this may result in your son/daughter being pulled from the trip)
- All equipment listed on the Information Pack (will be shared during the meeting and with selected candidates)
- Visa prior to arrival for specific countries (you will be informed if this is your child's case)

Costs

- The total trip cost is estimated between \$1600-\$2000 USD
- The approximate cost **includes**
 - Airfares to and from Tanzania (Phnom Penh- Kilimanjaro- Phnom Penh)
 - Visas (on arrival)
 - Travel and health insurance
- Not included in the cost
 - Fundraising **\$350 USD** per student to support community service projects in Tanzania
 - Items needed for the trip *Full packing list will be shared with selected candidates
 - Medications and vaccinations
 - Food when travelling between destinations
 - Spending money
 - Extra luggage
 - Any unforeseen extra costs
- Nord Anglia Education provides and pays for:
 - All food which includes breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks provided every day. (Staff will accommodate any dietary requirements)
 - Accomodation at Shamba Kipara Camp single gender tents fitted with comfortable beds and plenty of storage space, western style toilets, showers, WIFI, professional kitchen, swimming pool, recreational areas and 24 hour security.
 - Private transport around Arusha region
 - Safari overnight camp

Typical Tanzania Seeway Expedition Itinerary

Some parts of the itinerary are subject to change based on final students numbers

Day 1 - Arrival Day

The Nord Anglia team will greet NISC group upon arrival at Kilimanjaro International Airport and take it to Shamba Kipara Camp for an introduction talk and tour of their home for the next eight days. Our students will spend the day relaxing and settling into their new environment with free time to meet students from other Nord Anglia schools.

Day 2 - Exploration of local village and community project

Your child will spend the day trekking on the edge of Arusha National Park taking the opportunity to enjoy nature. As part of this day students will also travel through local villages and have the opportunity to observe how people live in this area.

Later, the group will get to Dolly Bush Estate where they will pitch tents to spend the night and they will cook their own food.

Day 3 - Continuation of community project

On this day the group will travel to the community of Nazaretti where they will be actively participating in community service work which will improve the life of families in this area.

The group will then be taken back to Shamba Kipara Camp.

Day 4 - The Seeway Project

Your child will contribute to the building of new classrooms, kitchens and bathrooms at selected schools which have been receiving the support of Nord Anglia and Seeway NGO. The group will then be taken back to Shamba Kipara Camp.

Day 5 - The Seeway Project

Your child will continue working at the Seeway Project site. The group will then be taken back to Shamba Kipara Camp.

Day 6 - Day one of safari in Tarangire National Park

The group will travel to the Tarangire National Park. Here they will learn about the local biodiversity while carrying out an animal survey. Your child will spend the night camping in the park.

Day 7 - Day two safari in Tarangire National Park

The group will wake up early to catch the sunrise and continue their journey through the Tarangire National Park before heading back to the Shamba Kipara Camp. On the way to the camp, students will be able to visit Shanga, a local organization empowering disabled people and providing them a safe working environment.

The last night in Tanzania will bring the Expedition together for a BBQ.

Day 8- Departure day

This day will be similar to the arrival date and will depend on departure times. Each group will have a debrief and reflection session followed by free time to say goodbye to friends and get ready for their journey home.

Spaces are limited, therefore submission of application before May 31st 2019 and a parent present at the information session on May 28th or May 30th are both required to be considered.
