


WEEKLY PARENT NEWSLETTER - Pre Nursery 25 November 2013

Learning Theme of the week

Next week we will begin the wonderful theme of Christmas. The classrooms will be transformed into winter wonderlands, encouraging the children to explore many different activities in lots of sensory ways.

Understanding the World

• Enjoys playing with small-world models such as a farm, a garage, or a train track.

Communication, Language and Literacy

- Learns new words very rapidly and is able to use them in communicating.
- Developing understanding of simple concepts (e.g. big/little).

Mathematics

- Beginning to categorise objects according to properties such as shape or size.
- Begins to use the language of size.

Expressive arts and design

• Experiments with blocks, colours and marks.

Next week we will read the story of 'Father Christmas' By Raymond Briggs to the children and watch short clips of the film. We want the children to get that Christmas feeling and what better way to do it by seeing Santa Claus.

As it is our learning journal event, the teachers will be spending some time looking at the children's learning journals, introducing them to the new concept of 'e-journals ' and encouraging them to talk about their past learning.

The Christmas show is fast approaching and we will spend some time in the theatre, becoming accustomed to the new surroundings and 'have a go' at what will be an amazing show!

Our Mathematics focus for the week will be numbers to 5, counting in different ways and with different objects. We will encourage the children to count each object one at a time by playing a game where Santa is feeling very hungry and needs to eat some Christmas cakes. Each cake will have a number on and we will count these one by one as Santa eats them!
