Dear Students and Parents

As you will be aware already, the academic year 2020-21 at The British School of Kuwait (BSK) will begin online, with lessons commencing on Sunday 06 September 2020. We are excited to welcome our incoming Year 10 students as they start their GCSE and IGCSE courses, and we look forward to working in partnership with all of you.

We are firmly committed to the development of the whole student and have been working tirelessly over the summer in order to further enhance the virtual school experience of our students. We of course look forward to welcoming students on campus as soon as it is safe to do so, but in the meantime our aim is to provide our students with a remote educational experience that is as similar as possible to that which they would receive on-site.

In order to ensure that our Year 10 students get the most out of their virtual learning experience it is vital that we maintain a strong sense of community, continue to work together and stay connected. We will be sharing a great deal of important information with both students and parents over the coming weeks and we would ask that you all check your emails regularly and reach out to us in the event of any queries.

Academic Provision

The **Year 10 Curriculum** is a very important one as it marks the start of GCSE and IGCSE studies. All students in Year 10 will follow a full academic programme of subject lessons each weekday.

Returning students will be familiar with the Google Meet platform and will benefit from lesson delivery enhancements implemented over the summer that are designed to improve communication and collaboration within lessons. The introduction of a **Virtual Secondary Student Planner** and **Virtual Exercise Books** is also designed to help our students maintain the type of mature and organised approach to their studies that we expect of our senior students. Details regarding this will be provided in the start of year induction materials to be released shortly.

Regarding textbooks, we would ask that any parents who are yet to do so kindly complete the Textbook Order Form as soon as possible so as to avoid any delays. Pastoral Provision

In order to support our Year 10 students as they begin this important first year of their GCSE and IGCSE studies, there have been further enhancements to our pastoral programme for this year.

Each Year 10 student will be allocated to a Tutor Group and will attend daily Tutor Time each morning. This is a vitally important part of the school day and provides an opportunity not only for sharing

important announcements but also for checking on how our students are doing. The wellbeing of all of our students is a priority within our Year 10 Pastoral Programme and will feature prominently within both PSHE lessons and daily Tutor Time activities.

The Class Tutor has a vital role to play in supporting students so that they can get the most out of school. As such we would encourage all Year 10 students to be proactive in asking for help or clarification if they need it. We would also encourage all parents to liaise closely with their child's Class Tutor in order to support them in making the best possible start to their GCSE and IGCSE studies.

It is also important that students are familiar with key policies and procedures related to daily aspects of school life such as attendance and punctuality, as well as rewards and sanctions. The **Virtual Upper Department Student Handbook** will be made available on our website shortly that should be reviewed carefully before the start of the school year. As we are sure you can appreciate, we will also inform you in writing of any adaptations that are required to our usual policies and procedures in order to accommodate the period of eLearning.

Getting started and staying connected

We would ask that you all read this carefully and ask for clarification if there is anything you are not sure about.

The first two lessons of the academic year will consist of **Year 10 Extended Tutor Time**, and this will provide students with a thorough orientation, as well as an opportunity to ask questions about anything they require clarification on before they start their lessons.

We understand that starting the academic year online is a new experience for everyone and we are here to help you navigate that process, so if you have any questions whatsoever please just ask and we will be happy to assist you. In the meantime, we wish all of our incoming Year 10 students the very best for the new academic year.
