

Our world-class partnerships enhance education in science, art, business and social impact

REVOLUTIONIZING EDUCATION

We partner with leading research institutions to expose our students to the latest, cutting-edge thinking in science, technology, engineering, art and mathematics (STEAM).

MIT STEAM PROGRAM

In a groundbreaking collaboration with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Village has designed a series of in-school challenges that focus on the intersection between STEAM disciplines, including bioengineering, robotics, and computer science. Every year, teachers and students participate in workshops with MIT academics at the annual Cambridge Science Festival, an opportunity to learn directly from researchers at the world's leading STEAM institution. Village and MIT also pioneered Launch Club, a startup initiative that gives students a framework to launch their own companies and nurture their entrepreneurial skills.

CERN BEAMLINE PROGRAM

Every other year, our students have the opportunity to visit Conseil Européen pour la Recherche Nucléaire (CERN) in Switzerland as part of the CERN Beamline for Schools program. This highly competitive program enhances our students' understanding of particle physics in the areas of nuclear medicine, energy sustainability and the universe.



SCIENCE BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

At The Village School, our long-standing excellence in STEAM education extends beyond the classroom. Our students have the opportunity to challenge their abilities in STEAM competitions, further their knowledge in enrichment programs and apply their insights in internships. True to our culture of champions, our students often excel in nationwide competitions and conferences.

SCIENCE BOWL


The Science Bowl is a renowned competition where high school teams compete to solve technical problems and questions across science and math disciplines. Village students have won regional championships and runner-ups at the national level.

SCIENCE OLYMPIAD

The Science Olympiad is a premier student competition that promotes academic excellence and educational enrichment in the sciences. Students are given the motivation and skills training to learn beyond their classroom material. In 2018, two of our students, Jerry Han and Alex Liu, placed in the top 10% nationally in the US National Biology Olympiad.

OFFSHORE TECHNOLOGY CONFERENCE

The Offshore Technology Conference (OTC) is the largest event in the world for the oil and gas industry, featuring more than 2,300 exhibitors and attendees from 100 countries. The Village School team, composed of Divyesh Khatri, Olivia Bangs, Roberto Martelli and Omar Imtiaz, secured 3rd place at The 50th OTC Energy Challenge.

PUMPS & PIPES SUMMER STEAM ACADEMY

This 4-week summer academy is designed for high school students interested in pursuing further study in Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics (STEAM). In this selective program, students solve real-world challenges and learn by visiting renowned research facilities in aerospace, energy and medicine, such as NASA, ExxonMobil and Houston Methodist, where they work in collaboration with industry-leading professionals.

Our top-tier internship program serves to reinforce The Village School's philosophy of experiential learning. To secure their internships, students work closely with the Student Internship Programs Coordinator at Village. PREPARING FOR THE WORLD STAGE WITH THE JUILLIARD SCHOOL

The Village School expands student creativity and ignites imagination through our collaboration with The Juilliard School, a world leader in performing arts education. Working closely with the school, we weave Juilliard's core philosophies and methods into our performing arts program, enhancing student learning. Through hands-on workshops with experienced Juilliard performers, students are exposed to diverse performance types and unique creative approaches. Our educators also benefit from continual professional development and annual workshops with Juilliard faculty and curriculum specialists.

We introduced Juilliard concepts into our dance program. The curriculum incorporates ballet, tap, jazz and multicultural dance to provide students with a diverse experience.

HOW VILLAGE AND JUILLIARD IGNITE OUR STUDENTS' PASSION FOR MUSIC

CREATING WORLD-CLASS PERFORMERS WITH FRANTIC ASSEMBLY

The Village School has partnered with Frantic Assembly, an internationally renowned theatre company, to train our students in innovative performance and production practices. Village students spend a week working closely with Frantic Assembly practitioners to create an original performance of their own. During the residency, students will be introduced to Frantic Assembly's unique take on devising performances and physical theatre.

Frantic Assembly is responsible for award-winning productions such as *Harry Potter Live and The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Nighttime*. They have toured extensively across Great Britain, and worked in 40 countries internationally, collaborating with some of today's most inspiring artists. Frantic Assembly has been liberating the potential of future theatre-makers for over 21 years. Working with over 10,000 young people aged 14+ every year, the company runs workshops and works with young people in schools, colleges, universities, youth theatres and more.

DIVERSE ARTS CURRICULUM

We incorporate a wide variety of fine and performing arts into our curriculum so that students can develop their breadth of study, improve their skills portfolio and uncover new passions. Throughout our academic offerings and extracurricular activities, we make the arts accessible to students of all ages and skill levels.

DANCE

Our dance program develops well-rounded performers who are skilled in a broad spectrum of dance forms. Not only do students practice skills and choreography, they also attain a deeper understanding of dance production methods. Our collaboration with The Juilliard School supplements our teaching with additional resources and access to the latest dance innovations.

THEATRE ARTS

At Village, we take an interdisciplinary approach to theatre arts. Aside from teaching performance methods, we train students to incorporate singing and dancing, among other fine art skills, into their productions. On- and off-campus performances allow students to reach the surrounding community through their work.

MUSIC

Musical training is available to all students as a pathway for self-discovery. The Village School has dedicated resources for developing musical talent, from orchestra training to vocal lessons. Beyond the band and choir, we offer unique extracurricular opportunities for students to discover their interests, including a residential student orchestra and a student-led jazz band.

VISUAL ARTS

Self-expression takes many forms in our visual arts program: drawing, painting, pottery, sculpting and more. Our instructors work diligently to foster an appreciation for the visual arts regardless of skill level and personal experience. Students are encouraged to incorporate new media and take on cross-curricular work to strengthen their experience. THE ENTREPRENEURSHIP DIPLOMA


Village proudly offers a four-year Entrepreneurship Diploma in collaboration with Bridges to Wealth at the Netter Center for Community Partnerships at the University of Pennsylvania. We recognize the need for an innovative education that gives students the professional skills to succeed beyond the classroom. We're preparing our students to excel in the jobs of tomorrow and to navigate the fast-paced evolution of our global economy.

Freshman students have the opportunity to enroll in the Entrepreneurship Diploma Program, which covers finance, management, marketing, strategy, private equity, venture capital, negotiations, decision-making, systems thinking, leadership

and more. Within the Diploma, students can specialize in either the Engineering or Social Enterprise track. Both are taught by industry-leading professionals and entrepreneurs, exposing students to the fundamentals of entrepreneurship.

CAPSTONE PROJECT

The Entrepreneurship Diploma culminates in a Capstone Project, where students launch their own enterprise to meet a community or industry need. With mentorship from entrepreneurs and professors, the students research, ideate and execute a solution that solves real-world issues. This beyond-the-classroom approach enables students to develop the business literacy and interpersonal skills integral for future entrepreneurs.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS (ELL) PROGRAM

The Village School is committed to supporting non-native speakers of the English language. We offer two levels of ELL classes to give students the reading, writing, listening and speaking skills to thrive academically. Students who are more proficient in English will be integrated into mainstream classes to accelerate their language acquisition. Language support is provided in specific subject areas to ensure student success.

Boarding students in the ELL program receive academic support through structured study halls and evening prep time, where they do individual/group work or receive peer-to-peer tutoring. Our ELL support team also organizes SAT prep classes for all juniors, as well as listening and speaking classes for new language learners.

CLASS TRIPS

Taking our curriculum on the road, we provide hands-on learning opportunities for our students all around the country.

7th GRADE

On the 7th grade trip to Boston, students see places from their history books come to life. Students visit landmarks that are central to our country's founding, including Plymouth Plantation, the Mayflower, Lexington, Concord, Paul Revere's Church, Betsy Ross' Home, Salem and Boston Harbor.

10th GRADE

10th grade students take a service-focused trip to Southern Florida, where they are immersed in Cuban culture and engage in community service. This service-learning experience enables them to diversify their cultural knowledge and grow as civic-minded citizens.

8th GRADE

In the 8th grade, our students visit Washington D.C. and Gettysburg to learn about our national history. At the National Holocaust Museum, Mt Vernon, WWII Memorial, Vietnam Memorial, Gettysburg Battlefield, Liberty Bell and Independence Hall, students see how our country's most significant events impact their lives today.

11th GRADE

As part of their IB group 4 science project, 11th grade students travel to the Marina Lab in Southern California to conduct field research. Through scientific enquiry and onsite investigation, students develop a greater appreciation for the environment. The goal is for students to work constructively with others, take initiative and build scientific literacy.

9th GRADE

RESIDENTIAL DORMS

STRUCTURED AND SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

Recognizing that this may be the first time our students have lived away from home, we have designed a strong support system to ensure that students can thrive. Our residential life leadership team has over 30 years of combined experience in caring for students. The team of eight, consisting of a director, coordinator, academic advisor, activities coordinator and year group leaders, foster academic success, provide emotional support, and enforce disciplinary actions. They are also assisted by a large group of dorm parents and school staff that pay close attention to our students' needs. Having student well-being as our core mission has allowed us to become one of the highest rated boarding programs in Texas.

CARING COMMUNITY

We strive to create a home away from home for all of our boarding students. Our Year Group Leaders ensure that students at each grade level are well taken care of academically, emotionally, and physically. They will be in contact with parents weekly regarding student progress. We also staff more than twenty dorm parents who help students adjust to residential life throughout the year. At the beginning of each semester, dorm parents will introduce new boarding students to the area, helping them discover the Village campus and its neighboring Houston area. The students and staff have monthly family dinners, such as Texas-style BBQ on the patio or traditional dinner in the cafeteria.

SCHOOL SAFETY

The Village School's highest priority is the safety and well-being of our students. Our safety measures include Houston Police Department presence and monitoring, 24-hour security guards and staff, security cameras throughout the campus, keycard access gates, personalized keyless entries to student suites, and hotel/security safes in each room.



- Local police and law enforcement officers on campus during school hours positioned at each front reception desk
- Local HPD SWAT Team training held on campus for active shooter response

In addition, The Village School's leadership team and faculty attend regular trainings and seminars on safety, wellness and emergency preparedness and response.







DINING

Exceptional nutrition is core to our mission of enriching student life. Partnering with the industry-leading Flik Dining, we provide high-quality and nutritious meals that can accommodate a wide range of dietary needs. Meals are provided for all boarding students in-residence, including a communal buffet-style dinner. We provide opportunities for residential students to dine out occasionally as part of regularly scheduled social activities.

Our students begin their day with a breakfast of champions. Both day students and residential students dine together, enjoying the chef's creations such as scrambled eggs, buttermilk pancakes, French toast, bacon, sausage and breakfast potatoes. Students can choose to indulge in specialty offerings such as Asian eggs and rice, breakfast tacos, an omelet bar and a make-your-own-waffle bar. We also offer an assortment of bagels, cold cereals, breakfast pastries, and a fresh fruit bar with low-fat yogurt.

At lunch and dinner, our salad bar features a bountiful display of fresh vegetables, condiments, and proteins. Our chef prepares homemade soups served daily, and a variety of accompaniments. Our popular deli station features a variety of sandwich selections and cheeses, with an assortment of breads, rolls, and wraps. Students also get to enjoy fresh sushi offered several days a week. Highlights of our dinner entrées include Norwegian salmon with saffron cream, Asian sesame chicken, beef enchiladas, pork and chicken pot stickers and shrimp jambalaya. Vegetarian options such as vegetable ettoufe, stuffed shells with marinara, and vegetable egg rolls are offered daily at both lunch and dinner.

WEEKEND ACTIVITIES

Once classes have ended for the week, students enjoy an exciting social life enriched with weekend activities. Our weekend programming includes excursions to museums, state parks, movies and local points of interest that allow students to experience the community and culture around the school. 
