
Critical Thinking Here at NIS

Here at NIS we want all our students to be able to inquire, think, investigate, and innovate so that they have the chance to become the educators, researchers, and leaders who can solve the most pressing challenges facing our world, both today and tomorrow.

While at NIS we do not yet offer a fully integrated STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Mathematics) programme, we are already preparing young people for STEAM orientated futures. Scientists and engineers get to do some pretty cool things. They challenge their brains to examine, explore, and solve real life problems. They develop hands-on projects to make new discoveries and use technology effectively. They work collaboratively in teams, sharing expertise, and knowledge, generating multiple ideas to complete projects. The principles of STEAM—critical thinking, asking observation good questions, exploration—are truly at the heart of every discipline so we try to make core subjects like Maths, Science and Technology relevant for students. At the same time, we foster creativity, curiosity and a passion for problem solving, and create learning environments full of active classrooms where multiple right answers abound and failure is regarded as a positive step toward discovery and a successful solution.

We also adopt a project-based way of teaching and learning, allowing students to exploit cross-curricular skills, and to understand and appreciate the relevancy of their work to the world around them. In the last few weeks it has been fascinating to see how the students across different classes have been involved in the design cycle; Year 1 children planning, making and evaluating their own toys; Year 4 & 5 students trying to solve the problems of how to make working, noisy moving objects; and Year 6 students creating their business plan for their social enterprise company 'Green Leaf'.

As we move forward, we will continue to keep a sharp focus on STEAM; building on our curriculum offer, expanding STEAM orientated resources and providing wider educational experiences enhanced with Nord Anglia Education's partnership with MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology). It is an exciting future for our young people and we want to excite them to be ambitious for their own futures and the world they can help shape.





Our Very Own Wushu Master Mr. Septiana





Well done to our very own PE teacher and Wushu Master, Mr. Septiana who won a coveted first place at a national Wushu competition last week. Despite being almost 10 years older than the other competitors, the 23 years of Wushu practice, dedication and training mean that he is still at the top of his game. Mr Septiana has practised, taught and competed in international level competitions for this martial art over many years and strongly believes that practising Wushu develops not just physical health but also instils important values such as discipline, respect and resilience. He brings this philosophy into his teaching, by educating the children about the importance of a healthy body and a positive mindset. He nurtures and challenges them to overcome their fears and to practise their skills, and models that with hard work and determination we can all make good progress.
