Founded in September 2016, Nord Anglia Chinese International School Shanghai (NACIS) offers students a creative, challenging and rewarding learning experience. Students aged 6 to 18 years old are welcomed into our progressive and internationally-minded school community. The majority of our student population are Chinese nationals who actively work to develop international-mindedness and intercultural competence, and are committed to participating in diverse communities. We offer a distinctive bilingual, integrated learning programme leading to the International Baccalaureate Diploma. A rapidly expanding school, NACIS is currently home to approximately 2000 students.

Our first cohort of IBDP students have graduated in July 2019. International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme

(students aged 16-19, participation rate 100%)

In Grade 11 and 12, students complete the IB Diploma Programme (IBDP). As a school with high academic expectations and a philosophy for students to 'Be Ambitious' academically, socially and personally, the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme is the only programme we offer to graduating students. Students commonly select one subject from each of six discipline options. At least three (and not more than four) of the six subjects are studied at Higher Level (HL). The remaining subjects are studied at Standard Level (SL). If the students do not choose a course for group 6, we offer a second course for group 4. In addition, all Diploma students complete the following core components:

Extended Essay – an independent, self-directed piece of research which develops independent writing and research skills and provides the opportunity to investigate an academic research question of individual interest.

Theory of Knowledge – a unique course that provides a forum for discussion and instruction that explores the nature of knowledge and how we know what we claim to know.

Creativity, Action Service – a programme that strengthens and extends students' personal and interpersonal learning through experiences: Creativity – exploring ideas leading to original or interpretive outcomes; Activity – physical pursuits contributing to a healthy lifestyle; and, Service – collaborative and reciprocal engagement with communities in response to authentic needs.

IB examination performance in individual subjects is graded according to the following IB scale: 7. Excellent 6. Very good 5. Good 4. Satisfactory 3. Mediocre 2. Poor 1. Very poor N. No grade

For an IB Diploma student, the total score available for all subjects is 42 points, plus an additional 3 points for the Diploma Core (Extended Essay and Theory of Knowledge components combined).
