## Learning Theme – People Who Help Us

## Understanding the World

We have an exciting week ahead with a visit to the local fire station planned on Wednesday. The visit will be taking place in the morning and we will be back in school in time for lunch so the children will not need to take anything extra with them. We will be learning about the role of firefighters in the community. The children will get the chance to see where the fire fighters sleep and eat, they can watch them go down the pole, and they will get the chance to go on the fire engine and wear a fire fighters hat. We will be encouraging the children to ask questions to find out more about being a fire fighter. Back in the classroom we will talk about the things we have found out and we will begin to talk about fire safety.

**Key Vocabulary:** Fire engine, fire station, fire fighter, hose, hat, uniform, boots, equipment, pole, fire, ladder, building, burning.

## **Literacy:** Speaking, Listening & Attention

We will continue to encourage children to ask questions, and develop their questioning skills. We will think of all the things we would like to find out about when we visit the fire station and which questions we will ask. After the visit we will discuss what we did find out, and consider how our questions were answered.

#### **Phonics**

We will continue to play a variety of games, in both whole class and small groups, throughout the week. These games will vary from helping the children 'tune in' to different sounds they hear and focus on single letter sounds in familiar words. We will continue to read and sing rhymes as part of our daily routines to support children's understanding of rhyme and alliteration.

## Mathematics:

We will count daily with the children and encourage numeral recognition and will also be working with sorting activities, linking to our 'Learning Theme' and puzzles to encourage the children to explore and develop their understanding of shape, space and orientation.

# Expressive Arts & Creativity:

As our role play areas develop there will be plenty of opportunity for children to use their imagination, whether they are in a baby clinic, a post office, or another area relating to 'People who help us'. We will also be using various media and materials to represent our fire engine trip. Be prepared for lots of red paint and art straws!

# Mandarin

We are going to talk about different occupations including teacher, doctor, nurse, fireman and police. We will focus on who they are, what they do and how important they are in our lives. The children will be learning a song related to teachers and also a song exploring colours and colour names.

Key words: teacher 老师 (lao shi ) doctor 医生 (yi sheng ) nurse 护士 (hu shi ) fireman 消防员 (xiao fang yuan ) and police 警察 (jing cha)

#### Dutch
