

Year 4 Curriculum Brief 19/20 Term 2

Curriculum Synopsis

The curriculum of Islamic Studies for year four focus on verses of the Qur'an, and the messages of the Prophet Muhammad (Hadith). It aims to give pupils a clear, thorough understanding of Islamic teachings, moral behavior and Islamic etiquette. Furthermore, it aims to give pupils a clear, thorough understanding of Islamic teachings, moral behavior and Islamic etiquette, and its contribution to modern science.

Some of the influential personalities in Islamic history are studied, such as the life of Prophet Muhammad, Moses, and Jesus (PBUH), role models, values and ethics. Moreover, student's skills in Tajweed are developed through reading the Holy Qur'an.

The Islamic syllabus covers five main areas which are imparted to students in a continuous and a systematic way to support their understanding, enhance their reflective thinking.

For the second term the students will study the following topics:

- Surat Al-Al-layl (Divine Revelation): Students will start understanding how to do tafseer for the verses and link it with our daily life.
- The etiquette of hospitality (the moral of Islam)
 Students will draw the etiquette of visits and hospitality.
- Belief in Prophets (Mosses and Jesus) (Islamic belief)
 Students will infer the wisdom behind sending the Messengers and explain some miracles of Moses and Jesus.
- The Qualities of the believer>
- Read the Hadith and draw out the prophetic guidance contained in the Hadith.
- Abu Baker As-Sedeeq.
 Infer the effects of the true belief of Abu Bakr As-Sedeeq in the Prophet (PBUH)
- Fasting (Islam's values and morals).
 Students will demonstrate the concept of fasting and find out the wisdom of fasting during Ramadan.

Supporting at Home

Support at home helps to embed student's relationship with the Holy Quran as the first source of knowledge, behavior, values, taste and beauty in order to build a Quranic mentality and psychology, by continuing to read the Qur'an and taking into account the provisions of intonation (*tajweed*). One of the pillars of this support is to implant the love of Prophet Muhammad "peace be upon him" in the heart of the student through the experience of the Prophet's biography, and provide the life of the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) as a good example and a role-model to follow.
