Being around enthusiastic and creative young people is one of the great privileges of working in a school and today I was delighted to be invited to a business meeting with our year 6/7 students. The students are in the process of creating their own social enterprise company and had prepared their "pitch" requesting a start-up loan. I was most impressed with their goal of creating a company that raises awareness and money for key global issues such as; the rights to education for all, environmental campaigning against single-use plastics, and humanitarian responses to natural disasters. I was also impressed with the business ideas and the entrepreneurship shown by the students. Feeling confident about this new business, the school has provided an enterprise loan to the students who will then be responsible for managing their company finances.



Over the coming weeks, the children themselves will share more information about their company and how you can support them. On Saturday, however, they will host their first event – a pop-up Healthy Tuck Shop at the Family Fun Day selling tasty and healthy snacks and drinks. 50% of their profits will be reinvested into their business with the other

50% being donated to one of their selected charities. We hope you will support our young entrepreneurs on Saturday and help their business get off to a positive start.

We are all looking forward to Saturday's Family Fun Day and hope that you, and your family and friends, will come along and enjoy the fun. There will be lots of activities to keep the children occupied giving parents the chance to socialise and chat over coffee. We hope the weather will be kind and that we have an exciting morning of family fun.
