On World Book Day, children are invited to dress up as a character from any book. Children may create a costume or a themed hat, etc. Children will also enjoy a 'Read-a-Thon', where 'reading stations' will see teachers reading their chosen class book to groups of children. Children will be encouraged to read in many ways; independently, paired, with an older buddy, etc. with a focus placed on enjoyment of books.
