Pupils will be taught to:

- Name, read and write Phase 2, Narrative: Stories with a journey 3 and 5 sounds. Stories with repetition
- Apply Phonic knowledge to decode unknown words.
- Non-Fiction: Read common exception words from Phase 2, 3, 4, 5. Cards
- Identify the difference between Reviews Instruction texts fiction and non-fiction books.
- Clarify words and infer clues from the text.
- Make predictions and give Handa's Suprise reasons for their answer using evidence from the text.

- Pupils will be taught to: • Identify features of a sentence and begin to write simple sentences.
