

Judging your writing will be **Joe Craig**, a novelist, screenwriter, songwriter and performer. The first book in his best-selling Jimmy Coates series was published in 2005. Since then the seven books in the series have won over young fans across the world and converted thousands of previously reluctant readers with an electric mix of action, suspense and thrilling twists. When he's not writing he's visiting schools, playing the piano, drawing, inventing snacks, playing snooker, cricket and football, watching a movie or reading. Judging your illustrations will be **Matthew Loffhagen**, an award-winning professional illustrator who specialises in cartoons, comics and bright fun artwork. He was born in England but moved to Hong Kong when he was a teenager, and studied Comic Art as part of his degree. Matthew started drawing when he was very young and has never stopped. In school he would get in trouble for doodling in maths lessons, but he insists that he's a better listener when he's drawing something!

After years of practise he began working as a professional artist in 2012.

He regularly creates vibrant and colourful new artwork for book covers, and also illustrates an online comic strip, MagiPunk, which can be seen at www.magipunk.com.
