It has been a very busy term for Year 10 students, with many being involved in extracurricular activities and competitions in Shanghai and further afield. Many students have been involved in sporting activities, with successes in football, basketball and swimming. In addition, the Maths department has been busy with the Maths Olympiad in which a number of Year 10 students performed extremely well. We also had students Travel to Tanzania for the Global classroom project and others travel to Nanjing for a Math challenge. A large group are also preparing for their IA trip in April.
