The School Day

The school day begins at 7.45am and you must be in your form room or assembly by 7.50am at the latest. It is your responsibility to ensure that you are punctual for form time and your lessons.

You are expected to be in school for full days - students are not permitted to sign out and go home early. Arrangements for parent permission to leave the site for lunch will be communicated at the start of the year.

If you leave school early for a valid reason, such as a medical appointment, you must sign out at reception. Where possible, appointments should be made outside of the school day.

Sixth Form Entrance Criteria

BSKL has an A Level entrance criteria to ensure you thrive on your chosen A Level courses.

A Level entrance criteria:

- 5A*-C or 5 5-9s in (I)GCSEs including English and Maths
- A*/A/B or at least a 6 at IGCSE required in selected A Level subjects

Subject specific:

- A*/A or at least a 7 at (I)GCSE required to study A Level Maths or A Level Physics
- A*/A or an 8 or 9 in (I)GCSE Maths to study A Level Further Maths

Please note that we will review all student's applications to our Sixth Form on a case-by-case basis.

Any changes of options choices will need to be within the blocks and students meet with the Head of Sixth Form prior to the first week of term 1 to finalise their options.

To change a subject you need to do the following-:

- 1) Discuss the proposed change with your form tutor. Make sure that the switch works from a timetable and option block perspective. If you still wish to proceed with the change after this discussion you then need to-:
- 2) Check that this is a sensible change in light of your university ambitions. Make sure you are not 'closing any doors'. If you are unsure please speak to the University Counsellor.
- 3) Speak to the teacher(s) whose subject you wish to drop. This should be done face to face as a courtesy, not via email or your form tutor.
- 4) Speak to the teacher(s) whose subject you wish to switch to. Find out what work you need to catch up on and listen to their advice about the switch. Do not start attending their lessons at this stage.
- 5) A final decision on the switch will be made by the Head of Sixth Form and will require parental confirmation before it can go ahead.

Students may also apply to study for the EPQ qualification as a 4th or 5th subject. Most universities only require, and only look at, 3 A-levels so studying 4 for two years is not necessary and may reduce your grades in the other subjects.

We usually encourage all subject choices to be finalised in the first four weeks of Term 1

In addition, all students will attend a compulsory Physical Education lesson per week to ensure they are continuing to participate in physical activity and this is a good opportunity for students to interact with each other in a different environment.

Extended Project Qualification (EPQ)

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a Level 3 qualification (the same as A-Level) that offers you the chance to study a topic in depth. It can be done alongside 3 or 4 AS subjects in Y12. All students attend a lesson introducing them to the EPQ during tutorial at the start of Year 12.

If you are interested in undertaking the EPQ qualification you will have a discussion with the Sixth Form staff team to make sure it is in your best interests and will complement your other studies. The EPQ is a good way to strengthen your university application, especially if you study a topic that will directly relate to your chosen degree course.

Some topics that have been studied in previous years for the EPQ are:

- Does an airline's brand name have an impact on its market share?
- A book exploring teenage mental health.
- A study of Batik art and it's links to today's fashion.

Homework

Homework is recognised as just one aspect of students' holistic development at BSKL.

Homework in the SIxth Form at BSKL will:

- Allow for valuable assessment opportunities.
- Inform future planning.
- Add value to learning and promote progress in a subject.
- Be manageable for students (in terms of workload), whilst also challenging them.

Homework will be set regularly by Sixth Form teachers to include holiday homework and comprehensive examination revision. Sixth Form students should expect to receive around 5 hours of homework per subject per week.

Dress code

Sixth Form pupils are our ambassadors and it is therefore essential that Sixth Form students convey the highest possible standards of work, behaviour and appearance. Sixth Form pupils should set a positive example to all other pupils. BSKL Sixth Form students wear business dress.

Textbooks

Most subjects will provide you with a textbook to accompany the A-level course. In all cases textbooks will need to be returned in the same condition they are given to you. Any textbooks that are un- returned or returned in an unsuitable condition will be charged to your parents at the current selling price to allow the school to purchase a replacement.

Please make sure you treat any textbooks respectfully.

Examinations and Study Leave Procedure

AS Level exams start at the beginning of May and you will be given a personalised copy of your exam timetable.

You will be offered the opportunity of opting for study leave from early May (exact dates communicated annually). Students are welcome and are encouraged to continue to come into school to study. Teachers will email you directly if they need you to attend a particular lesson for revision purposes. It is important that you attend these sessions as requested.

You are encouraged to remain in school and to continue to follow your usual timetable after study leave commences. Until you have sat a subject exam, teachers can offer personalised and group intervention and support. A school day also offers structure and routine, and a school environment can be more conducive to learning for the majority of students. There will be support at hand from key staff, including the pastoral team.

The following procedures are essential, and must be adhered to, to ensure your health and safety:

- You must arrive to school 45 minutes before the scheduled start of the examination. Please refer to the exam timetable.
- You must have photographic ID for all examinations (this can be your BSKL student ID tag).
- Students must sign in and out at Secondary reception desk
- You can wear BSKL PE kit or Sixth Form dress code for examinations.

All Year 12 students return to school after the examination period in June.

Year 13 students are not required to return to school after final exams but please bear in mind that there will be events such as Y13 Graduation and Y13 Prom that you will be encouraged to attend. These events will be completed by early July.

You will be required to complete a Year 13 Leavers Form. You will be given a hardcopy of this form but a link to the form is here.

Co Curricular Activities

There are opportunities to be involved in a wide variety of activities and services where they will learn new skills. These include leadership roles and extra curricular clubs; the International Gold Award, MUN, sports clubs, community service, music groups, school production, FOBISIA events and much more.

BSKL will be in touch with students at the start of Term 1 to communicate the extra curricular activities on offer and students are encouraged to sign up.

International Award (IA)

The International Award (IA) is the international equivalent of the Duke of Edinburgh award in the UK. At BSKL we offer the Bronze award to Y10 students, the Silver award to Y11 students and to all Y12s the Gold award. You do not need to have completed your Bronze or Silver award to sign up to the Gold award.

Not only is the IA a great way to make new friends and experience new things, it also valuable in support of your university application. To take part in the IA it is important you have an interest in outdoor pursuits.

Self Organisation

As a Sixth Former you will have more freedom and more occasions where you need to make the right choices about what you do with your time. With this freedom comes more responsibility.

In terms of organisation, as a minimum you must have-:


- An academic diary or online diary
- Stationery pens, pencils, ruler, calculator etc.
- A school bag
- A well organised folder or exercise book for each subject
- The textbooks required for lessons

Items such as lined paper will be provided but it is a good idea to carry your own supplies.

It is important that you make the most of your study periods within school. If you use your study periods to their fullest you will find coping with the workload of A-levels a lot more manageable.

Reporting Absence

All absences from school must be communicated to your form tutor by your parents. Your parent(s) should email your form tutor as early as possible on the day of your absence and continue to email your form tutor on each day of the absence. You are responsible for emailing your subject teachers to inform them of your absence as far as possible.

Absences for holidays during term time will be unauthorised.

Missed Lesson Procedure

If you miss a lesson for any reason it is your responsibility to catch up on the work you have missed. You should also email your teachers, in advance, for any lessons that you miss.

After any missed lesson you must-:

- Check the Google classroom for any work missed and/or email the teacher(s) whose lessons you missed to ask the teacher what work you need to do to catch up
- Agree a deadline for when this work needs to be completed

As a Sixth Former, it is imperative you miss as few lessons as possible and catch up quickly on any work missed.

Common and Study Room Etiquette

The common room is your space as a Sixth Former. This is a very special Sixth Form privilege. It is therefore essential that this area is treated with respect. To make sure this space is enjoyable for all you should-:

- Keep your bag and possessions in your locker to avoid excessive clutter
- Respect other people's property
- Wash up any cups you have used
- Leave the area clean and tidy
- Put all rubbish in the bin
- Keep your feet off the sofas and tables

Other things to be aware of-:

- The pool table is strictly only to be used during break, lunch and afterschool.
- Music can be played in the common room during break, lunch and after school. This should be kept at a sensible volume and only played through the main speaker/sound system.
- Canteen meals should not be consumed in the common area. Snacks and drinks are allowed.
- You should not be in the common room after 5pm on any school day.

As with the common room, the Sixth Form study room is a privilege for all Sixth Formers. The study room is to be used for silent study at all times. This room should not be used for any other purpose. It is really important to your's and all other Sixth Formers education that you have a quiet place to work.

Lockers

You will be provided with a locker in school. You will be expected to use this locker to store your personal items such as PE kit, books, folders etc. The Sixth Form common room and study room should not be used to store your things. You will need to purchase a padlock to keep items safe.

Canteen arrangements

The Secondary campus canteen is open from 11.30am until 1.30pm. As a Sixth Former you are allowed to eat at any time in that window. If you have a study period for period 4 then you are encouraged to eat during this time to avoid the peak time at 12.30pm.

All meals should be consumed in the canteen and not taken to the Sixth Form common area.

Vehicles and parking

Sixth Form students who drive to school are welcome to park in the school car park. Students will be directed which floor to park on. Students must register their car with the front desk team and will be provided with a parking sticker.

Wellbeing support and Counseling

Your wellbeing is paramount and is something we cover during My World and your individual 1:1s with teachers. Your tutors and Head of Sixth Form are here to support you. Please approach a member of staff with any concerns or questions. BSKL employs a full-time counsellor and you are welcome to discuss a referral with the Head of Sixth Form

Behaviour Policy


The behaviour of the vast majority of Sixth Form students is exemplary at all times and students serve as both role models and ambassadors for younger students, the BSKL community and the wider community.

Alumni

The alumni who have volunteered their time have attended universities in countries such as the UK, Australia, Canada, Malaysia and the US. A flavour of what is on offer includes alumni studying: Medicine in the UK, Music in the UK and Australia, Computer Science in Australia and the US, Biological Sciences in the UK and Law in the UK. Universities represented Include: LSE, Imperial, UCL, Edinburgh, Loughborough, Toronto, Sydney and Melbourne.

Moving forward we also plan to provide Alumni events in a range of countries to connect our BSKL graduates who are living all over the world.

As part of our Sixth Form offering BSKL organises two dedicated tutorials sessions per week to support our students.

University Application Agreement

The goal of university guidance is to support the submission of university applications worldwide which result in excellent matches and ultimate placement for you. It is important that the number of universities you apply to is well considered.

The University Application Agreement is here

With the support of tutors and the Head of Sixth Form you and your family are responsible for managing your applications, adhering to the timelines and submitting relevant materials.

The use of an outside university consultant or agent must be registered with the Head of Sixth Form and University Counsellor. All documents from the school will be mailed directly to universities and not shared with agents.

SAT or ACT Test for USA University Applicants

Students who are interested in applying to study in the USA need to complete either the SAT or ACT admissions test at least once before the summer break between Y12 and Y13. Students usually sit the exam at least twice to maximise their score on the test.

There are a range of SAT/ACT and other admissions tests providers which pupils are welcome to use.

Student Leadership/ House system

BSKL has a House system made up of four Houses and if you are a new student you will be allocated a house when you join the school. You will remain in this house for the duration of your time at the school.

During Sixth Form there are many opportunities to take on leadership roles in the school. These include Head Student, Prefect posts in a variety of categories, Student Council and House Roles. Most of these roles are allocated in the first term of the academic year.

Map of Secondary School

Floor 6
