



Our work with the Xa Dan School throughout the year

We have had many wonderful student exchanges, raising awareness of disabilities with Xa Dan school for hearing impaired, a community partner of BIS since 2016. Xa Dan students have also helped to teach our students a little sign language.

In 2019 we have strengthened our friendship with XA Dan School as sixth form students regularly visit to deliver English and games workshops at the school part of their CAS program.

Throughout the year, BIS has also upgraded and donated old school laptops and fixed and donated old projectors. Through ticket sales and other community projects, BIS has raised funds to buy and deliver speakers to assist teaching and learning at Xa Dan School.

Y2 building of a new playground

BVIS Hanoi and 'Think Playgrounds' have decided to invest the money we fundraised into building a playground for more than 1000 children at Duong Nhan commune, Dong Anh, Hanoi. This community is mostly agricultural based and often faces difficulties making ends meet. We hope that a new playground will support children's emotional and physical growth.

On May 25th, many of our Year 2 students and parents came out to Duong Nhan commune to help build this playground. Throughout the morning, we had a lot of fun painting the wooden frames and other parts of the playground, along with planting flowers in the playground area. Local children also joined in. It was such a lovely time for us all.

April, May, June 2019

Children to Children project

Collection of games, art supplies, hygiene products and toy

Based on the Global Challenge Children to Children project we organised a donation drive for child asylum seekers in the Czech Republic.

The school community in the Kamyk campus were asked to donate educational games, art supplies, hygiene products and toys. These will then be placed in welcome packs with the letters of welcome students have also written.

Year 8 and 9 took a lead role in advocating for this cause, however, students from all year groups were invited to contribute. The donations will help children feel welcome in their new country, as well as providing them with educational resources.



Creation of welcome bags to donate to the child refugees

All year 7 students decorated and designed tote bags for the refugee welcome packs which are part of the Global Challenge Children to Children project PBIS are working on this year. The students created their own designs, meaning that they could express some of the things that they had learnt about refugees through their English, drama, music and art lessons this year in visual art. The bags will be delivered to 50 asylum seeking children in the Kostelec nad Orlici asylum centre in June. This will hopefully give the children psychosocial support and help them to understand the local community better.

Thailand Humanitarian trip - April 2019

10 students had the opportunity to take part in the humanitarian trip in Thailand this year from April 12th to April 25th. The main goal of the trip was to help finish the primary school facilities in a remote Akha tribe village in the mountainous northern region in Thailand.

The students worked intensively an average of eight hours a day under 40 degrees and humid conditions, helping out by mixing cement, plastering walls, tiling the floor, cooking and painting the walls. The students interacted with the village children and with local engineer university students in charge of the project.

A celebration ceremony was held by the whole village to celebrate the finished facilities, including traditional Akha dances. This year the new school facilities were painted in white in homage to the Royal family.

The village chief, local authorities and education representative made touching speeches and the whole village was very grateful for everybody's help towards improving the conditions of the local children's education.

The rest of the trip included a visit to a tribe taking care of elephants where the students have had the opportunity to help clean and to feed the elephants.

The group visited multiple temples, experienced a Buddhist ceremony, enjoyed local markets in Chiang Rai and in Chiang Mai and visited waterfalls in a national park. A truly unforgettable experience.

This trip marks the 10th anniversary of the humanitarian trips organized by Laurence Pian, president of the Jan and Oscar foundation in collaboration with the College Champittet Foundation.

“Share your Christmas” Food Drive


