Our subject in the Spotlight this week is...Drama

Year 7: In term one, students focused on honing their physical skills and looked to develop their understanding of nonverbal communication whilst working in the style of mime. Students will now be putting these skills to use learning about the art of melodrama. Melodrama requires a flamboyant acting style and a highly exaggerated use of voice and gesture.

Year 8: Year 8 have been developing their knowledge of the genre of Italian comedy known as 'Commedia dell'Arte'. Using their understanding of the stock characters, they will now rehearse and perform extracts from the script 'Alota - Chocolata'.

Year 9: Students have been mastering the style of fast paced storytelling and multi-role playing while studying the script 'The 39 Steps' adapted from the novel originally written by John Buchan.

Year 10: We have a made a good start to the GCSE course and students have impressed me with their maturity whilst studying 'The Crucible' by Arthur Miller. This is a very complex play about the Salem witch trials of 1692. Students are developing an understanding of how to apply the skills of a performer, director and designer to this text.

Year 11: I have been extremely impressed with the commitment and dedication shown by the Year 11 GCSE Drama students so far this year. They have approached their devised practical exam with energy and enthusiasm. A fantastic first term and a great start to the year!
