Sunday schedule of activities

Activity	Venue	Brief Description of the ECA
Secondary Badminton Club	Hall	Learn the skills of serving, return of serve using strokes such as overhead drop shot, overhead smash, overhead clear, net drop shot and learn about the tactics and placing of shots in singles and doubles badminton.
Chess Club	Room 116	Learn about playing the game of chess and learn ways to beat your opponent. A great ECA for students who are newcomers and experienced players of chess
Secondary Vocal Club	Room 179	This ECA is a really fun way to spend an hour after school singing with friends. You will be involved in group singing, harmonizing, and maybe even some solos if you are feeling brave. A range of musical styles.
EAL + English Conversation	Room 105 students from Yrs 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11	For students who are developing English language- this activity will support your ability to hold longer conversations making both academic English and interactions with peers easier For EAL students only
Qura'an Club	Prayer Room 15A or 15B	Students will be taught the teaching of the main rules of reciting the holy Qura'an and improving Qura'an memorization

Table Tennis Club	Shed 2	Students will learn the skills of serving, return of serve using a variety of strokes to keep the rallies going in singles and doubles table tennis. Focus on the basic rules and regulations associated with the game.
Secondary Drama Club	Room 151	For students wishing to perform in concerts and performances in school. A chance to develop different styles of acting and create your own performances. We will work on existing extracts from play and musicals, developing scenes for performances.
Reading and Writing Arabic Stories	Venue TBA	Native Arabic speaking students will learn to improve their basic reading and writing skills and gain confidence to share their own work with others
Yr10 and Yr 11 Arts & Crafts Club	Art Room189	A chance to develop and receive feedback and guidance on your GCSE Art work. Strongly recommended for GCSE Art students
Year, 7, 8 and 9 Science Club	Room 108	Are you brave enough to enter the wonderful world of Science? Join us on our adventure every Monday to do experiments that will blow your mind!!
Year 6, 7 and 8 Archaeology Club	Room 5	A fun look at some past societies and ancient civilizations through their material culture, as well as learning some basics of fieldwork and archaeology techniques. This ECA will also run with Year 6 Primary students.
Math's Magic Club	Room 115	Get involved in mathematics board games that test your arithmetic skills. Play against each other in a scrabble type numbers game.

Debating Club	English Room TBA	Develop debating skills with a focus on preparing students for the national selection process to have an opportunity to attend the World School Debating conference. A great ECA for students to share their views with others through debating Great support for future University applications
English, Mathematics and Science Homework Club	Room 133	Complete homework at school or get extra support after school from teachers in the core subjects (English, Mathematics and Science). No need to sign up for this ECA but can drop in when needed. If you attend and catch a school bus please remember to inform your bus monitor
English Reading Club	Room 106	KS3 students will complete activities based on the books read and discuss about what you learnt reading the books. KS4 students will have writing practice tasks based on the books read- Good GCSE preparation. Will lead to taking part in the Emirates Airline Festival of literature
Secondary Scriptorium	Room 105	Creative Writing: We will be following AWA format of group writing. AWA is an international community of writing workshops committed to the belief that a writer is someone who has a unique voice through writing. Students will be encouraged to take risks to develop their own creative style to produce stories and poems in a secure, supportive environment.
KS3 Art and Crafts Club	20 students max	In this ECA the students will have a chance to develop new skills in Art, or develop upon your existing work. There will be a chance to have your work displayed in an art exhibition as part of this year's art events.
