Aims

How does Tic Tac Toe work?

- Students are to complete two tasks over the term in each subject area.
- For Task 1 students have a choice from 4 different tasks.
- All students complete the same Task 2.
- For each task that is chosen there is a due date
- In some cases this is denoted by 'w/c' which means week commencing. Students should then submit the work in their lesson that week.

How long should students spend?

- Students should spend around 45 minutes on each task in Year 7.
- Students are encouraged to break up the tasks into research, producing and proof reading.

Keep it simple, maybe research only 5 types of clouds.</p>

LO: To interpret and cross-refer sources to understand about a past event.</p> <p><i>Task: Find two primary sources about the Black Death that suggest different causes of the disease.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Annotate the sources.</i> - <i>Write a summary of the interpretations explaining <u>why</u> they differ.</i> <p><i>Challenge: Include a quotation from a historian supporting the interpretation for one or both of the sources.</i></p> <p>Due date: WC 30/04/2018</p> <p><i>Top Tip: You might want to consider Nature, Origin and Purpose (NOP) in your answer.</i></p>	<p>1. LO: Explain, analyse and make judgments about historical events and periods.</p> <p><i>Task: Write an obituary for Wat Tyler explaining what kind of man he was.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <i>Have a clear opinion on him.</i> - <i>Must include an image.</i> - <i>Include key events from his life.</i> - <i>Include evidence to back up your opinion.</i> <p><i>Challenge: Identify that some have a different view whilst explaining that yours is the correct interpretation.</i></p> <p>Due date: WC 30/04/2018</p> <p><i>Top tip: Look at an obituary in a newspaper to show how to compose your obituary.</i></p>

2. LO: To be confident drawing and interpreting distance-time graphs.

Task: Draw a distance-time graph for your journey to school. This should be done on graph paper and the following things should be labelled:

- Times when you/ the vehicle is stationary, e.g. when at traffic lights
- Times of increasing speed (acceleration)
- Times of decreasing speed (deceleration)

Additional notes about core subjects

MATHEMATICS

- Students in Key Stage 3 will be set two pieces of homework per week.
- One piece will be set from *MyiMaths*, an online portal for which the students have personalised logins. These pieces will be marked online and their results logged. The tasks can be done several times for more practice, as the tasks change each time.
- The second piece of homework will be written, and should take around 20 minutes. It will be marked by the teacher or by peers in class.
- If homework is not completed the Behaviour for Learning policy will be applied and additional Math's Department detentions may be set.

ENGLISH

- Students in Key stage 3 will be set two pieces of homework per week.
- One piece will be set in direct relation to the classwork, and should take a minimum of forty minutes.
- The other piece will be shorter and relate to key skills such as spelling, punctuation and grammar: for example, revising for a spelling test, correcting punctuation in a text etc.
- All homework will be recorded in student planners. If not completed additional department sanctions may be set.
