

4 communities within the school




4 communities within the school

How the House helps you as a Year 7 parent?

oHead of House

- Same person, getting to know you and your child as individuals throughout their time at NAIS HK.
- o looking after your child's interests at school and watching his or her academic progress & welfare.

o House Tutor

- Someone who will see your child every day and be your main point of contact for day to day issues. If you have any routine news your child's tutor is the person to contact.
- e Checking your child has important notices, is doing well at school and writing their school reports as a key academic monitor.

How the House helps you as a Year 1-6 parent?

oHead of House

- An extra level of support for your child between the Head of Year and Principal. A person who can work with you and your child on serious issues throughout their time at the school.
- Encouraging your child to develop the skills and attitudes which come through being part of a vibrant community, including teamwork and service to others.

o House Champions

- For each Key Stage their will be a member of the Primary staff assigned to each house.
- These 'champions' work with the Head of House to organise great House competitions and encourage your child to get involved with the different activities of the community.
