English

Reading

Pupils will be taught to:

- Name, read and write Phase 2, 3 and 5 sounds.
- Apply Phonic knowledge to decode unknown words.
- Read common exceptions words from phase 2, 3, 4, 5.
- Re-read books to build up fluency and confidence in word reading.
- Making predictions and asking questions about an unknown text.

Writing including T4W

Narrative:

Stories with familiar settings.
Lost and Found stories.
Journey Stories.

Non-Fiction:

Spelling/Grammar/Handwriting

Pupils will be taught to:

- Identify features of a sentence and begin to write simple sentences.
- Use capital letters, full stops and finger spaces when writing sentences.
- Begin to use ? and ! in sentences.
- Begin to use the conjunction 'and' to join sentences.
- Identify what an adjective is and begin to use them for description.
- Form upper and lowercase letters more accurately.
- Form digits 0-9 accurately.
- Spell common exception words and days of the week.

Year 1 Curriculum Overview



The Magic Toymaker



Learning is opened through an entry point to engage pupils and assess their current understanding.

Entry Point

Year 1 will have a 'Toy Picnic' with their favourite toy to launch our new topic.

Knowledge Harvest

Recap what children learnt or thought about from the Entry Point activities. The children will then mind map everything that they know about toys.



At the end of each unit, outcomes are celebrated an exit point

Exit Point

Children will host a 'Toy Sale'. Toy donations will be made and all proceeds will be given to a children's charity.

Year 1

Mathematics

Number and Place Value

Pupils will be taught to:

- Order and compare numbers up to 100.
- Compare height, length and measure.

Fractions

Pupils will be taught to:

- Find unit fractions of a number.
- Find unit and non-unit fractions.
- Find fractions of a shape.

Geometry

Pupils will be taught to:

- Recognise and name common 2D shapes including; rectangles (and squares), circles and triangles.
- Recognise 3D shapes.
- Use positional language (forwards, backwards, left and right).

Speaking, Listening & Drama Opportunities

Pupils will be taught to:

- Learn and rehearse familiar stories through role play.
- Talk about immediate experiences.
- Understand and respond independently to clearly expressed questions and instructions.

PSHE

Pupils will be taught to:

- Identify similarities between people in my class.
- Identify differences between people in my class.
- Can talk about what bullying is, and know who to talk to.
- Know how to make new friends and talk about ways in which I am different from my friends.

Science

Everyday Materials

Pupils will be taught to:

- Pose simple Scientific questions
- Be able to plan an investigation to help them find the answer.
- Carry out an investigation that they have planned.
- Develop their understanding of materials by choosing specific materials to fit a purpose.
- Know how a range of forces such as push and pull move an object.

Topic

Pupils will be taught to:

- Recognise different toys from the past.
- Play and compare games from the past and present.
- Compare toys from around the world.
- Understand what materials were used to make toys from the past and why they are different today.
- Create a timeline of toys from the past through to today.
- Recognise toys created for festive celebrations and why.
