It was also inspirational to learn that the puppeteer was a 12 year old boy who has been learning and practising since he was 4 years old. This was a very special way to learn about Indonesia culture especially for Year 4-5 who have been learning all about this traditional art form and making their own shadow puppet performances.

We also had creative toy making workshops with local artists helping the children to make their own toys



and a tasty chocolate workshop with chocolatiers from Monggo Chocolate. Each of these experiences provide great new learning for the children and open their minds to the life and work of different people within our wider community here in Jakarta.
