- Pupils should aim to use the website at home for an hour or more a week for their own choice of activities.

### Stay Safe on the Global Classroom

The Global Classroom is carefully monitored to ensure students are using it safely and appropriately.

#### Please follow the following rules:

**Be nice!** -- The Meeting Place is a place for everyone. Whatever you're discussing, encourage and support one another. Any offensive messages or comments about individuals, schools or teachers will be deleted.

**Think about your post** -- Is it interesting to other people? Does it add to the discussion? Is it likely to get replies?

**Read what's there already** -- If there is a thread with a similar title, join that one instead of starting a new one.

**Choose the right title** -- When you start a new thread, make sure the title says what it's about – then people are more likely to look at it. Be specific.

**Is the topic suitable?** -- Please don't start conversations about games, films, TV programmes or music that aren't suitable for your age group (Years 4-6). Any conversations like this will be deleted.

**Sign off** -- Sign off with your name and school. This helps everyone get to know you better and makes your post friendlier.

**Stay safe online** -- The Global Classroom is a safe community for Nord Anglia Education students. However, you still need to remember not to share personal online details. This includes Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, Skype or other personal accounts.
