









Type of activity


UNICEF works in the world's toughest places to reach the most disadvantaged children and adolescents – and to protect the rights of every child, everywhere. Across 190 countries and

UNICEF was established on 11 December 1946 by the United Nations to meet the emergency needs of children in post-war Europe and China. In 1950, its mandate was broadened to address the long-term needs of children and women in

developing countries everywhere. UNICEF now works in over 190 countries and territories to protect the rights of every child. For over 70 years, UNICEF has been the defender of children around the world, regardless of gender, religion, race or economic background. When the world's most vulnerable need a champion in the face of conflict, disease or exclusion, UNICEF has been there.









